OCT 6, 2013: FRED HOCHBERG PART 1

In Part 1 of this two-part series, Aaron talks with the President of the United States Export-Import Bank, Fred Hochberg. The conversation includes a discussion of what the Export-Import Bank is and what services it provides, as well as thoughts on the Obama Administration, the state of Small Business in America today, the issue of Job Creation, and the move towards Renewable Energy.

OCT 13, 2013: FRED HOCHBERG PART 2

In the conclusion of this two-part series, Aaron talks more with Fred Hochberg, President of the United States Export-Import Bank, about the Bank's operations and recent projects. Hochberg also shares his perspective on being a gay man in the U.S. government and his optimism about the country's movement toward equality.

OCT 20, 2013: JOHN ALLEN PART 1

In Part 1 of this special two-part series with retired Four-Star General John Allen, former commander of U.S. Forces in Afghanistan, the conversation focuses on Allen's experiences during Operation Enduring Freedom, currently the longest war in U.S. History. Total cost of the war, training of the Afghan Armed Forces, and the dramatic changes undergone in Afghanistan over the last decade are all discussed.

OCT 27, 2013: JOHN ALLEN PART 21

In the conclusion of this special series with General John Allen, former commander of U.S. Forces in Afghanistan, Allen and Aaron discuss ongoing efforts to reach a resolution between Israel and Palestine. Also discussed is the continuing situation in Syria, and Allen's reflections on the concept of Leadership.

NOVEMBER 3, 2013: JON WELLINGHOFF

In this episode of "The Energy Roundtable" Aaron talks with Jon Wellinghoff, the Chairman of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. The Chairman gives background on what FERC does and how it works with the 50 states and acts as a market regulator. Also discussed is the recent "explosion" of LNG—Liquefied Natural Gas, the future of "the grid" and energy sales in the U.S., and what Wellinghoff says was the biggest challenge of his tenure.

NOVEMBER 10, 2013: NORA VOLKOW PART 1

In the first half of this two-part series with National Institute on Drug Abuse Director Nora Volkow, the focus is on the human brain. What do we know about the brain today? What emerging technologies are taking us into the future of the study of the brain? Also discussed: how our brains heal, grow and evolve, and how drugs damage the brain.

NOVEMBER 17, 2013: NORA VOLKOW PART 2

In the conclusion of this two-part discussion with Dr. Nora Volkow, the conversation delves further into our knowledge of the brain. Differences between child and adult brains, how exercise and what you eat can effect your brain health, how memory is retained, and the mechanics of addiction in the brain are all discussed.

NOVEMBER 24, 2013: JAMES MCPHERSON PART 1

In the opener of this two-part series with Pulitzer Prize winning Historian James McPherson, the American Civil War is discussed. Topics covered include: McPherson's Book "Battle Cry of Freedom," the lack of historical knowledge today, a few civil war facts, and whether or not there is still new information about the Civil War being unearthed today.

DECEMBER 1, 2013: JAMES MCPHERSON PART 2

In the conclusion of this two-part series with Pulitzer Prize winning historian James McPherson, the conversation delves further into the Civil War, answering questions like, "What would the world look like today if the Civil War had a different outcome," and "Why is the Civil War relevant today?" Other topics include: Ironclad ships, famous Civil War battles, Neo-Confederates, and the Civil Way Sesquicentennial.

DECEMBER 8, 2013: REPUBLICAN GOVERNOR'S RACE PART 1

In the opener of this two-part series with four of Colorado's Republican gubernatorial candidates—Senator Greg Brophy, Secretary of State Scott Gessler, Senator Mike Kopp and Congressman Tom Tancredo—the conversation begins with an overview of each candidate's platform and why they believe Governor Hickenlooper should be retired. Later the discussion turns to one of Hickenlooper's more controversial decisions—the choice to stay the execution of death row inmate Nathan Dunlap.

DECEMBER 15, 2013: REPUBLICAN GOVERNOR'S RACE PART 2

In the conclusion of this two-part series with four candidates for the Republican nomination for Governor of Colorado, the conversation runs the gamut of hot-button issues, from gun control to fracking, wildfires, climate change, and Obamacare.

DECEMBER 22, 2013: LARRY CROWDER

This special episode explores a new perspective on our state through the point of view of rural State Senator Larry Crowder. The conversation spans a wide range of popular Capitol Hill topics including water rights, the death penalty, fracking, and the prison system. Specifically, Crowder discusses several of his votes that have crossed the party line, including his thoughts on the Affordable Care Act and its disastrous roll out across the country.

DECEMBER 29, 2013: FOOTBALL

In this exclusive episode, former Denver Broncos players Karl Mecklenberg and Reggie Rivers discuss the high-impact world of professional sports. Rivers and Mecklenberg reminisce about their careers, how the game has evolved since their retirement, and the community and business endeavors each is involved with today.
