#### **October 01**

Dambisa Moyo Part 1 –

In Part One of this two-part series, Dambisa Moyo, global economist, author, international speaker, and a member of the Board of Directors at Seagate, Barclays Bank, Barrick Gold, and Chevron, joins Aaron to discuss globalization, trade strategies and policies, how to improve education and the performance of schools and students. She also touches on her concerns about the Global Economy: technological advances, and the relationship between the jobless underclass and technology, especially as it related to future job creation. She posits that the demographics of the world --- now with 7.5 billion people and headed towards 10 billion --- demand extraordinary efforts to address underinvestment in education, income inequality, national resource scarcity, debt burden (especially in the U.S.), and lagging productivity growth.

In Part Two of this two-part series, Dr. Dambisa Moyo, global economist , author, international speaker, and a member of the Board of Directors of Seagate, Barclays Bank, Barrick Gold, and Chevron, discusses education and the strategies to improve it, the importance of having diverse minds in the business world, the mismatch between most election systems versus and the volume of problems we have which are long-term in nature and, as a result, are not readily solved with short-term solutions which may appeal to a particular political group or class. Lastly, Dr. Moyo discusses the qualities of a good leader and what real leadership is today.

Dr. Samuel Gandy, the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai Professor of Alzheimer’s Disease Research and the Director of the NFL Neurological Care Center as well as one of the world’s experts on the effects of head trauma, explains in-depth what

CTE (chronic traumatic encephalopathy) is. During the discussion, the show highlights the severe impacts of “hits” with video examples from several different football games.

### **October 15**

First Woman to be PBS CEO Pat Mitchell

Pat Mitchell the first female CEO of PBS join us to share her insights into the tv industry and how she worked to manage and grow the resource of public television during her tenure.

Healthcare Pioneer & National Leader Dr. Ken Davis

Ken Davis, the President and CEO of the Mount Sinai Medical Center --- whose 6,500 physicians and 38,000 employees handling almost 4 million patient visits annually are directed by him --- is a national leader in the healthcare industry and shares his thoughts on what is wrong with our insurance and health coverage systems in the U.S. and how he would like to see them changed.

Chasing Coral –

Jeff Orlowski is the Director, Producer and Cinematographer of the award winning documentary, “*Chasing Ice*,” as well as the brand new documentary “*Chasing Coral*”. As an environmental-oriented filmmaker, Jeff delivers a poignant message of the urgency to stop or slow the destructive alteration of our environment at the Poles and now globally in our coral reefs. His movies are extremely well shot, often with new technologies created at or around the time of shooting the footage.

Climate Leadership Council President Ted Halstead

Ted Halstead is the Founder, President, and CEO of the Climate Leadership Council. The Council has developed a solution to the political gridlock when it comes to addressing Climate Change by proposing a Free Market-based Carbon Tax in exchange for the elimination of burdensome environmental regulations. The Free Market approach and the elimination of regulations are attractive to Republicans and the significant decreases in Greenhouse Gas emissions which would occur due to the Carbon Tax are attractive to Democrats.

### **October 29**

Vassar College President/Health Expert Betsy Bradley

Betsy Bradley takes some time to talk with us about higher education, the development of Vassar from being an all women’s school to having the diverse student body it has today. She also talks a bit about the healthcare industry, problems facing our country and what needs to be done to keep and care for all Americans.

Elaine Chao, the U. S. Secretary of Transportation and former U. S. Secretary of Labor, focuses on critical improvements needed in America’s transportation infrastructure. She addresses the still safe but out-of-date U.S. Air Traffic Control system and explains how the shift to a GPS-based tracking to the system would reduce, congestion. Secretary Chao also explains the Trump Administration’s plans using Federal dollars to leverage State and private sector dollars to achieve the President’s goal of investing \$1 trillion to fund infrastructure improvements.

Commonwealth Fund CEO David Blumenthal

David Blumenthal, CEO and President of the Commonwealth Fund, discusses the current state and future of technology role in providing healthcare. He also compares healthcare in the U.S. to other countries. Blumenthal describes the pros and cons of electronic medical records, and explains what the future of medical record systems looks like and the adjustments we will need to make.
