As a result, today women in Rwanda have a remarkable role not only in the country's culture and economy but also in the operation and decision-making of its government.

John Lewis, Civil Rights leader and United States Congressman joins us on the program and shares his stories of crusading for civil rights in the 1960s among our country's most prolific activists.
