The President of Wellesley College, Paula Johnson, describes her background and expertise in healthcare and health policy. She also talks about the diversity and inclusion she plans on growing and continuing during her tenure at Wellesley.

February 18th

Dolores Huerta –

Dolores Huerta, prolific civil rights activist and the co-founder of United Farm Workers and National Farm Workers, joins Aaron on the show to discuss her work as a civil rights and labor activist. She describes how she dealt with some harrowing experiences as a young activist.

Elaine Chao –

Elaine Chao, the U. S. Secretary of Transportation and former U. S. Secretary of Labor, focuses on critical improvements needed in America's transportation infrastructure. She addresses the still safe but out-of-date U.S. Air Traffic Control system and explains how the shift to a GPS-based tracking to the system would reduce, congestion.

T. Boone Pickens, iconic Chair of BP Capital Management and Founder of the Pickens Fuel Corporation, discusses his historical role in the Energy Industry en route to the success which made him one of the most prominent names in the world as well as a billionaire.

Jim Wallis –

Reverend Jim Wallis, President and Founder of Sojourners, discusses spirituality in today's world. He talks about corruption in Washington D.C. and politics across the country. Reverend Wallis and Aaron also discuss the Civil Rights movement and how our culture today has been shaped by it.

March 4th

Nora Volkow 1 –

In this follow up two-part series with National Institute on Drug Abuse Director Nora Volkow, the focus is again on the human brain. What do we know about the brain today? What emerging technologies are taking us into the future of the study of the brain? Also discussed: how our brains heal, grow and evolve, and how drugs damage the brain.

Nora Volkow 2 –

In the continuation of this two-part follow up series with Dr. Nora Volkow, the conversation delves further into our knowledge of the brain. Differences between child and adult brains, how exercise and what you eat can effect your brain health, how memory is retained, and the mechanics of addiction in the brain are all discussed.
