GOVERNMENT

APRIL

- 4/1 La Fortaleza withdrawn the appointment of James Tuller to Superintendent of Police
- 4/1 After analyzing the report prepared by the Congress, former Gov. Rafael Hernández Colón foreshadowed mass layoffs and greater fiscal crisis if PR will become the 51st state
- 4/2 The former governor Rafael Hernández Colón says the congressional report on the impact of statehood for PR proves to be a bad deal for the island and the United States
- 4/4 Governor Alejandro García Padilla Governor appointed Colonel Jose Caldero as new Superintendent of Police
- 4/7 Attorneys of U.S. Department of Justice are on the island trying to find a candidate for monitor to route the agreement between the government of Puerto Rico and the federal
- 4/9 Today is the last day of Judge Federico Hernández Denton as Chief Justice of PR
- 4/14 Raided the residence of Judge José Manuel López Acevedo Court of Aguadilla who is presumed under the federal microscope
