JANUARY

- 1/1 The Journalists Association will file a legal document to ask for the access of video and photo cameras to the hearing by the Supreme Court in the case against the Reform of Judiciary Retirement
- 1/1 Governor Alejandro García Padilla evaluates various candidates due to the imminent retirement of the Chief Justice Federico Hernández Denton
- 1/2 The Resident Commissioner, Pedro Pierluisi, said Congress will assess if it's reasonable to file an annual estimate of revenue and expenditure of the Government of PR
- 1/3 PNP Representative José Quiquito Meléndez, will submit several complaints against the governor for using public funds for advertising
- 1/7 Agencies and public corporations might have to pay more for loans granted by private banks once transferred billions of dollars to the GDB
- 1/8 Telemundo and news organizations signed up a victory after the Supreme Court authorized the entry of cameras and press the View of Lawsuit system reform Judiciary Retirement

- 2/11 Cause for arrest and thousands of dollars in bail, against group accused alleged election fraud in Guaynabo
- 2/12 Governor Alejandro García Padilla accepted the resignation of Public Housing Administrator Vivoni Miguel Hernández, who attributed her departure to interference and obstructions of their duties

JANUARY

- 1/3 The President of the Teachers Federation predicted chaos in the school year beginning in August following the withdrawal of thousands of teachers
- 1/6 Members of the National Union of Teachers and Education Workers formed a picket line outside the entrance of the Julia de Burgos Park in Carolina, when the governor distributed toys to mark the Epiphany
- 1/7 Following the recent passage of Act 160, the broad front in defense of the Retirement System of Teachers announced a 48-hour strike next week
- 1/8 Teachers prepare to stop the second half start school
- 1/9 With a majority support, the teachers of the public school system began their day ahead of the start of classes
- 1/10 Teachers Federation officially announced that will join the national strike called for next Tuesday
- 1/13 In support decisive action, the Labor Movement announced its support for the teachers during the 48-hour strike to be held from tomorrow
- 1/14 The teachers' leaders claimed success in the first day of the 48-hour strike in protest at changes to the retirement system
- 1/14 Teachers in the south of the country, branded the anti-labor governor and repeal the law reforming its retirement system was required
- 1/15 With the participation of thousands of teachers ended the 48-hour strike to protest changes to the Retirement System educators
- 1/15 While the protest continues outside the Department of Labor, the Dialogue Committee met for solutions

- 2/13 The Diocese of Arecibo and Justice Department were summoned to the Superior Court of San Juan to attend the Extraordinary Appeal by Bishop Daniel Fernández Torres to not be forced to disclose the names of the six victims pedophile priests
- 2/19 The lawyer of the young victim of sexual abuse by a priest of Arecibo accept that the State could continue the investigation into possible crimes despite this claim of confidentiality made to the court
