Former President Trump visited an unfinished portion of the wall on the Mexican border on Wednesday, the trip with Texas Governor Greg Abbott near Weslaco in South Texas is Trump's second public appearance in a week . Republicans have pointed out that migration will be a central theme in their campaign to retake control of Congress next year, but a Reuters / IPSOS poll indicates that Trump's attacks are having little effect.

Meanwhile, more than 270 thousand migrants have been found in the sector of the Rio Grande valley by the border patrol so far this year.

On more gun violence issues, last Wednesday, President Biden on a visit to the state of Illinois discussed the issue of violence with the mayor of Chicago. Crime levels in the country are skyrocketing like never before. At least 150 people died from gun violence in more than 400 shootings across the country during the July 4 weekend alone, according to data compiled by the Gun Violence Archive. In Chicago, after police superintendent David Brown voiced his concern ahead of

the "most challenging weekend of the year" for police, 83 people were shot, with the death toll of 14. So far this year, incidents of gun violence in cities like New York, for example, have shot up almost 40% compared to the same period in 2020, with 767 shootings and 885 victims. In New York, Mayor DiBlasio said crime is going down.

Regardless of the fact that Donald Trump is not in power and we stop hearing anti-immigrant rhetoric, in some of our cities we do hear of black attacks on Latinos. Yamile Arango our correspondent in Denver, Colorado presents us the following report.

Activists have had their sights set on Texas, where Republican lawmakers are pushing a series of measures that include changes such as banning voting from their car and early voting 24 hours before election day.

In an attempt to obstruct the legislative process, more than 50 Democratic legislators from Texas came to the nation's capital to absent themselves from the special session in their state and call for Congress to take action at the federal level.

Meanwhile, the "For the people" and "John Lewis voting rights advancement" bills have stalled in Washington amid Republican obstruction.

On the other hand, Republican Senator from Florida Marco Rubio sent a letter to Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security Alejandro Mayorkas, demanding a full explanation of the measures taken by the department to ensure that terrorists who have been released by the Taliban cannot enter the country from the southern border with Mexico. Biden told Isis-k "We are not done with you yet," after he claimed responsibility for the August 26 bombing at the Kabul airport that left dozens injured and 13 soldiers dead. 4 of these Latino sailors whose families this week held vigils and prayed rosaries in the company of family, friends and neighbors. extended is highly unlikely. The situation at the border continues to be chaotic. September is not over yet, but it is estimated that the number of illegal immigrants crossing the southern border will again exceed more than 20 thousand encounters, the highest number in 21 years. This week the Paso Times reported that border patrol agents participated in acts of violence against Haitian migrants seeking asylum, associate press photographers reported images that we could only imagine in a western movie where agents on horseback with whips in hand they faced the Haitians. Pro-immigrant organizations condemned the events while at least 10,000 of them were

crowded on the Texas River Bridge. The secretary of national security Alejandro Mayorkas precisely visited the area on Monday and emphatically said: "the borders are not open, do not try." For his part, the governor of Texas, Greg Abbott, requested this Monday from the president of the United States, Joe Biden, a declaration of emergency for the state due to the immigration crisis on the border with Mexico. 26 governors of the country asked to meet as soon as possible with the president to discuss the matter. But the biggest setback to the immigration issue would come from the same congress. Elizabeth Macdonough, the Senate's top MP, said Democrats cannot use their \$ 3.5 trillion package that boosts social and climate programs to give millions of migrants the opportunity to become US permanent and naturalized. Our correspondent in the white house Rafael Sánchez Cruz made a report on the matter.

Following the recommendation to include a path to permanent legal residence for dreamers, holders of temporary protected status (TPS), and agricultural workers and essential workers, it went beyond a budget consideration according to detractors who have said for months that the legalization of the undocumented it will increase spending on federal programs such as food stamps, child tax credits, and health insurance programs. Now the ace up the Democrats' sleeve is reviving Ronald Reagan's Republican-era law. According to a recent report by the American immigration council (AIC) which states that the registry law "allows certain non-citizens who have lived in the United States for a long time, but who are undocumented or are present in the country under some type of temporary immigration status , 'register' to receive legal permanent resident status. One news item that made headlines around the world was the murder of the President of Haiti, Jovenel Moise, 53, assassinated on Wednesday at his home by a commando made up of foreigners. The first lady, Martine Moise, also shot, was hospitalized hours later at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami. Moise's assassination occurs during a deep security crisis and political instability in the country a few months before the call for presidential, legislative and local elections for next September 26, elections in which he could not be a candidate. He too had made enemies among the powerful armed gangs that control slums of the poorest of the poor in Port-au-Prince.
