Heroes Shaped By 9-11	Closer Look	11/28/2021	7pm	13:59	<p>CLOSER LOOK: Heroes Shaped By 9-11, Lessons From The Attacks On America For those who witnessed the aftermath up close, the effects of 9-11 were infinitely more personal than intrusive changes to airport security. The attacks redirected their personal health and professional ministries. Kevin Ellers, D. Min was in Kansas City when he was called to the Trade Towers collapse in New York City with The Salvation Army. Ellers has since designed curriculum with titles like Spiritual First Aid used to train first responders internationally. Rev. Dr. Tim Carentz was a young Air Force medic in D.C. when he got the call to the Pentagon on 9-11. He was eventually diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Leaning on faith in Jesus and the support of his military community, Carentz retired from the USAF as a Chief Master Sergeant and now operates Kaiserslautern Military Resiliency Center.</p>
