On the February 11th edition of East Tennessee Now, Darius Williams sat down with Brad and Chris of Remote Area Medical to discuss their upcoming free healthcare clinics coming to Harriman, TN April 20-21. Brad and Chris spoke about the wide variety of free medical services the clinics offer, including health, vision, and dental care. They also shed light on the impact that the clinics have on the communities they visit, given there are over 26 million Americans without healthcare, it is not uncommon for there to be a line formed days before their clinics officially open. The interview ended with the duo giving information on how people can register to volunteer as general support staff as well as licensed medical, vision, and dental professionals.

On the February 18th edition of East TN Now, Darius Williams sat with Megan and Travis from Knoxville Habitat for Humanity to discuss their upcoming community watch party for UT basketball. Megan and Travis talked about how the purpose of the event was to show appreciation to the volunteers and create a sense of community amongst its members while inviting the public in to learn more about the organization. Ashlee Crawford ended the show speaking with Kristina Killebrew from Second Chance Prom Ministry about their 12th annual formal attire and services event. Kristina shed light on the array of free formal attire they have to offer for occasions such as proms and weddings, along with the different services such as hair, makeup, and tanning.
