Description: World, national, state and local news given in brief stories every hour in the morning drive times. Information is gathered from National and other local sources.

Sample news stories covered:

7/3/17 – The Genesee County Health Department says an average of 200 people end up in emergency rooms with fireworks-related injuries around the 4th of July holiday. To encourage safety, the department recommends that fireworks only be used outdoors and under adult supervision. They also say to light fireworks one at a time and never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.

7/10/17 – Tens of thousands of Consumers Energy customers were still without power on Sunday after crews worked around the clock to restore service following severe storms last week. Full restoration might not be complete until later today for some homes and businesses in Grand Rapids and parts of Kent and Ottawa counties. Barry, Eaton and Muskegon counties also were among the areas hit hardest by the outages.

7/17/17 – A farmer in St. Johns is supporting a fellow farmer in the Charlotte- area with a sign along US127 that says The city of East Lansing discriminates against farmers. The sign is in reference to a decision made by the city of East Lansing to ban Country Mill Farms from its farmers market because of the owners religious beliefs. In May the Charlotte family <u>filed</u> a lawsuit against the city of East Lansing which is now pending in Federal Court.

7/24/17 – And rotting weeds along part of Grand Haven State Park are making it unpleasant to swim in Lake Michigan and have been clouding up the water for a couple of weeks. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources says it has been working on the problem for more than a month. Officials believe flooding in wetlands has killed and dislodged the grasses which wash into rivers that feed into Lake Michigan.

7/31/17 – Construction for a new Saginaw County jail will break ground in March or April of next year. It will house 511 inmates, and will cost \$35.8 million-dollars. The sheriff has requested the help of the council to move forward with the building process.

8/7/17 – Michigan is opting into a national public safety broadband network, known as FirstNet. FirstNet will build, operate and maintain a secure wireless broadband communications network for Michigan's public safety community at no cost to the state for the next 25 years. It's expected to boost broadband access in rural areas.

8/14/17 – The state of Michigan has reversed 70 percent of the unemployment benefit fraud cases and is

refunding nearly 21-million dollars after people were wrongly accused of collecting excessive benefits. The Unemployment Insurance Agency reviewed more than 62-thousand cases for people who were assessed a fraud penalty and did not seek an appeal. About 44,000 cases were reversed.

8/21/17 – Today is the day the first total solar eclipse visible to the US mainland since 1979. The total eclipse begins on the West Coast just after 10 a.m. Pacific Time and ends on the East Coast a little before 3 p.m. Eastern Time. The full eclipse will last the longest in Carbondale, Illinois where it will be visiblie for two minutes and 43 seconds.

8/28/17 – Today the state of Michigan will start issuing driver's licenses that residents will eventually need to board domestic flights if they don't have passports. Starting in October 2020, compliant driver's licenses or state IDs will be needed to fly or to visit federal buildings, nuclear plants and military bases. There's no extra fee for the card.

9/4/17 – Tourism at Michigans national parks is on the rise. The National Park Service says tourism is up more than 5 percent at the states national parks through July. The parks have seen a record number of visitors over the last two years, posting a total of 2.7 million visitors last year.

9/11/17 – The Michigan Army National Guard is sending more than 1,000 soldiers to the South to help people affected by Hurricane Irma. The Guard will be providing security, humanitarian assistance and aircraft maintenance. About 425 soldiers will head to Camp Grayling in northern Michigan, pack equipment and then leave for Florida tomorrow.

9/18/17 – Michigan Attorney General Bill Schuette received a high-profile endorsement in his bid for governor over the weekend. President Donald Trump tweeted about from his personal account about Schuette saying he "will be a fantastic governor for the great state of Michigan." Schuette formally announced his run for governor last week.

9/25/17 – Abnormally warm temperatures have Michigan apple growers taking extra precautions while harvesting sensitive varieties. If growers dont get "latent heat" out of the fruit before they are stored or shipped, the fruit could be affected. This weeks continued hot weather is also increasing the chances of them dropping before harvest.
