This is a Solid Foundation to prepare leaders in the church such as Pastors, Bishops, Evangelists etc. The school is non denominational both for student and faculty. there are two campuses in Bridgeport and Danbury Connecticut.

This is an annual fund raiser for the church. It assists them in their outreach programs.
4/27/2018	18 Minutes	Community	Community Hour: Gary Peterson Executive Director of the Bijou theatre, who spoke about value of the facility to the community and its intimate setting which includes an auditorium and café seating as well as V.I.P. and mezzanine and a dressing room. The facility houses concerts, plays seminars, political debates and church services. He spoke about the location and its proximity to the highways and is surrounded with parking and restaurants which is an attraction to patrons. The name Bijou is French which means “Little Jewel”
5/1/2018	16 Minutes	Community	Community Hour: Tammy Pappa Director of the Bridgeport Lighthouse program for after school programs speaks about the challenges for funding of the program through creative partnerships . She appealed to the community to help in this venture in maintaining this vital program for the children. They serve 3,000 children a day and over 26 schools in the area. She has a passion for providing this service. There are churches such as the Bethel AME that manages some of these programs. They are looking at ways in which they can use their programs effectively. The program seeks to identify safe spaces for children in the after school program. They offer a diversity of programs for the children in culture, science , math etc. They are a part of the state wide after school network the largest provider of this type in the state of Connecticut.
5/1/2018	16 Minutes	Health	Community Hour: Southwest Community Health Center Kathy Yacavone , Pat Jones in charge of OBGYN, and Carmen Rivera in charge of pediatrics . They spoke about the comprehensive services offered by SWCHC . A full service comprehensive health care provider , medical services , dental, mental and behavioral health services to anyone in the community regardless of their insurance status. They have the ability to make interdepartmental referrals on behalf of patients. They also run a WIC program as well. They care for women’s gynecological needs for women 45 years and older with no insurance. They have three sites in Bridgeport for OBYGN. Education, family and planning are vital to the community. They provide excellent pediatric care. They provide comprehensive information for the needs of children from birth to 21 years old. Food Vouchers are available through the WIC program and the patients are given guidelines by the nutritionist.
5/8/2018	15 Minutes	Health	Community Hour: Kestence Spence Diet Assessment Nutrition and Consultation and weight management person at the Norwalk Health Department and Outreach She speaks about the importance of good nutrition a healthy lifestyle and longevity . To be a motivator is essential to this service in helping people to change their lifestyle. She works with the WIC Program also providing resources for the patients. She spoke about her background as a Gospel Singer just as her Dad was. She started touring only about two years ago. She performs her father’s songs as well as her own compositions. She indicated that her family is important to her so she waited until her children were all grown before embarking on this new venture. She says that audiences all over have been very receptive to her performances. Her daughter accompanies her as a back ground vocalist. He emphasized the importance of individuals and their physicians making the health care choices for themselves and their families without the intrusion of the government or insurance companies. He said members of Liberty Health share have similar values in relation to the Christian faith however they are neutral regarding denominations. He directed potential members who may have been listening to visit the website to see the requirements for membership. The participants have an opportunity to interact with each other and thereby building relations based on their lifestyle and sense of values. 6/11/2018	20 Minutes	Community	<p>Community Hour: Dr. Roslyn Robertson Senior Pastor of the a Place of Worship Center in Norwalk. She says her church is centered in the concept of A God Experience which means that the church is able to use the acronym POW to demonstrate the power of the community representing the multicultural aspects of the Norwalk Community. Dr. Ros is a trained psychologist combining this with her pastoral role. She brings a practical approach to helping her congregants with a mental health ministry along with fulfilling their spiritual needs. She suggests that mental health is a stigma in the community, she is encouraging people to speak about their problems and helping them to find solutions with spiritual guidelines. She added that POW is a facility to include those who feel left out. The ultimate mission is to get people healthy and whole for service to God and to experience God in a way that they have not experienced him before.</p>
6/21/2018	30 Minutes	Community	<p>Community Hour: Mrs. Frankie White is the Executive Director of St. Marks Day Care center in Bridgeport. She spoke about the history of the center being 50 years old and serving the community of the years with an excellent quality of service. She says that they take youngsters as young as 8 weeks old providing the opportunity for working mothers to go to their jobs. They provide a variety of creative activities for the youngsters in areas such as gardening, learning how skills in areas such as carpentry are developed. They have the opportunity to learn and appreciate music learning to play the piano. She says that they discourage the watching of TV and therefore emphasized the importance of mental development and a healthy diet. She says that registration is year round and therefore parents are encouraged to contact them early in the morning to pick up the registration forms for their children. She appealed and continues to appeal to the community for financial help due to cut backs at the state level. She says all of her staff are trained and certified to consistently provide skills needed in the care of the children.</p>
6/25/2018	20 Minutes	Business	<p>Community Hour: Lucy Johnson owner of Laraquente and Johnson Real Estate Brokers. She spoke about the history of the company and says they have approximately 21 sales agents between Greenwich and Hartford. They specialize in negotiating Short sales, they have helped hundreds of people with acquiring a short sale. They assist in the purchase and sales of a home among other vital services. She sees a good future for Bridgeport and new construction throughout the state. She says there are great opportunities for home ownership including by FHA financing, there is conventional financing for investors. She spoke about a 203k rehabilitation loan for repairs and upgrade. For ownership she says a credit score of 580 is needed in this economy. They assist in finding a home once the prospective owner is qualified. She said it is better to own than to rent. She emphasized that a career in real estate can be very rewarding but it requires hard work and dedication. She says the process for a acquiring a real estate license requires a broker to sponsor a prospective sales agent before going through the required training such as the state exam. Lucy Johnson indicates that the current economic climate is right for home purchases. All there listings are registered in the standard MLS listing systems.</p>

He provided a quick review about Liberty Health share. He spoke about the power of large numbers and regarding the United States as that community.. He said community based churches functioned with these principles in the past and says that was the way it was before insurance became a way of life. He said that they believe that they have the God Given right to take care of themselves and each other. He indicated that this is intrinsic in the culture of the United States. The emphasis of shared values was at the core of his message for this month. He also mentioned the three different sharing programs. They can be viewed on their website. The one that is most frequently used is The Liberty Complete which is the most comprehensive program. He said they are sharing in excess of \$25 Million in medical bills each month. Assistant Pastor Wilson says her job in the church is to assist the Apostle and where ever she is needed. Prophetic Apostle Ecclesiastes Marquis, explained her name. She said that the name Ecclesiastes was given to her at birth she became known as Prophetess due to her early activities in the church. She spoke about Healing in relation to life.
