The study raises the uncomfortable possibility that some women who believe their lives were saved by mammograms were actually harmed by cancer screenings that led to surgery, radiation and even chemotherapy that they didn't need, said Dr. Otis Brawley, chief medical officer of the American Cancer Society, who wrote an accompanying editorial but was not involved in the study.

About one in 68 children born in the U.S. are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder, the developmental disorder that affects a number of brain functions-most notably children's ability to socialize and communicate. Because the first signs of autism aren't obvious until children start talking and interacting with others, doctors can't definitively diagnose the condition until babies are about two years old, when language and social skills start to emerge. Experts say that may be too late in terms of treating or minimizing the effects of autism, since whatever brain changes responsible for them have already taken place. However, a new report in the journal Nature may give worried parents new hope.

The company is specifically recalling Click & Go receivers that allow a car seat carrier to attach to a stroller frame. This specific Click & Go system is for use in Britax B-Agile and BOB Motion strollers. The company received 33 reports of car seats disconnecting from the strollers and falling to the ground, with 26 reports of injuries to children. The company is also aware of 1,337 reports of strollers with damaged Click & Go mounts.
Salud	Despierta America	03/22/2017	0:21	Several deaths from a rare form of Cancer have been linked to breast implants. Anaplastic Large cell Lymphoma was first linked to breast implants in 2011. The Food and Drug Administration announce Tuesday, implants have now been associated with nine deaths from lymphoma. As of February first, the agency had received more than 350 reports of the cancer associated with the implants. The FDA said it is likelier to occur with textured implants whether silicone or saline doesn't seem to matter. In many cases when the lymphoma occurs, removing the implant and the tissue around it, eliminates the disease but some women may still need chemotherapy and radiation.

Researchers at Worcester Polytechnic Institute in Massachusetts say they came up with the idea over lunch. First, they used detergent to strip the spinach leaves of their cells turning them translucent. Then they seeded the spinach veins with human heart tissue. After several days, the muscle cells began to beat. You can see the cell move as the red liquid courses through the spinach veins. The liquid is dye not blood. Scientists hope their research could someday help treat heart attack patients. The study published in the journal biomaterials.

A post on the pentagon's official science blog this week details the health risks involved, citing a report that found soldiers in the field were more likely to fall asleep on duty if they consumed multiple beverages a day. The study by the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research, titled "Energy drink consumption and its association with sleep problems among US service members on a combat deployment," looked at data from over 1,000 soldiers and Marines conducting operations in Afghanistan in 2010.

The suspect in Florida's deadly airport shooting travelled to Fort Lauderdale specifically to carry out the attack, authorities say. Authorities say Mr Santiago, an Iraq war veteran, opened fire after flying from Alaska with a gun in his luggage. There was no sign of any altercation on the flight or at the airport before the attack began, Mr Piro said. Federal charges have been filed against Mr Santiago and they should be outlined in detail later on Saturday.Mr

				<p>Piro said.- We continue to look at all avenues and all motives for this horrific attack. We are continuing to look at the terrorism angle in regards to the potential motivation. Mr Santiago is a former member of the Puerto Rico and Alaska National Guard, according to the Pentagon. He served in Iraq from April 2010 to February 2011, and ended his service in August 2016. US media reported that he had received a general discharge from the Alaska National Guard for unsatisfactory performance.</p> <p>His brother said he had been receiving psychological treatment recently. His aunt told a local newspaper he had "lost his mind" while serving in Iraq. He reportedly told police after the attack that the government was controlling his mind and made him watch jihadist videos.</p>

They will occur in response to the measures taken by the government of President Donald Trump in immigration matters.</p> <p>The president has promised to increase the deportations of illegal immigrants living in the country, build a wall along the border with Mexico and restrict the entry into the United States of immigrants from certain countries with a largely Muslim population. Salud	Noticiero Univision	02/26/2017	2:30	<p>A Republican outline for replacing the Affordable Care Act (ACA) could significantly reduce the number of Americans with health insurance and potentially cost states billions of dollars over five years, according to an analysis prepared for the National Governors Association on Saturday.</p> <p>The 36-page document, a copy of which was obtained by The Washington Post, attempts to evaluate the impact of possible changes included in a Republican leadership plan that outlines the direction Congress could be heading in as it attempts to fulfill President Trump's promise to repeal and replace Obamacare. The analysis, presented to a closed-door meeting of governors, was prepared by Avalere Health, a health-care consulting firm. The document was first described in a report published by Vox. Newly installed Health and Human Services Secretary Tom Price also attended the session.</p> <p>Trump has said the administration will offer its plan soon.</p>

President Donald Trump was at the White House.</p> <p>The agency says the individual - whom it did not identify - was arrested without further incident. No hazardous materials were found during a search of a backpack the individual carried. The Secret Service also says a search of</p>

				the south and north grounds of the White House complex found "nothing of concern to security operations." Homeland Security Secretary John Kelly was briefed on the incident. The agency didn't provide an update on the individual's status. Standard practice is to hand intruders over to the local police department.
Economía	Noticiero Univision	03/16/2017	2:06	Trump would eliminate the Legal Services Corporation, which helps almost 2 million people a year. The agency helps poor people find lawyers to resolve housing cases and navigate bankruptcy, and helps victims of domestic violence get protective court orders. The budget would eliminate \$434 million for a Labor Department program that aims to help poor senior citizens find jobs. The administration says the program is ineffective: A third of participants don't complete it, and only half of those who do complete it move into unsubsidized jobs. A program that offers federal funding to low-income families for help with home energy bills would be eliminated. Trump's budget describes the program as being "unable to demonstrate strong performance outcomes." The budget may cut funding for Meals on Wheels, a program that provides meals for older, poor Americans. Meals on Wheels says about 3% of its funding comes from government grants.
