Economía	Despierta América	07/07/2017	0:20	U.S. employers added a robust 222,000 jobs in June, the most in four months, a reassuring sign that businesses are confident enough to keep hiring despite a slow-growing economy. The Labor Department says the unemployment rate ticked up to 4.4 percent from 4.3 percent in May, which was a 16-year low. The rate rose because more Americans began looking for work, but not all found jobs. Job gains for April and May were revised higher by 47,000. In the first six months of this year, hiring has averaged nearly 180,000 jobs a month. That's only slightly below last year's pace. Yet even with the robust hiring, average hourly pay rose by just 2.5 percent from a year earlier. That's below the 3.5 percent pace typical of a healthy economy.

And it's across the board in all types of the packaged stuff. Lab tests of 10 different varieties of macaroni and cheese have revealed toxic industrial chemicals known as phthalates. Those are hormone-disrupting chemicals that can affect developing brains and alter thyroid function and sex hormones.
Seguridad	Despierta America	08/07/2017	0:22	General Motors has some very unfortunate news for the owners of roughly 700,000 of its pickup trucks: it's going to need you to go ahead and return those as soon as you possibly can. The vehicles are now the subject of an extremely large recall related to their power steering systems, so unless you're a fan of losing control of car as you cruise around town, it's probably a good idea to get that fixed sooner rather than later. The defect, which is present in many 2014 Chevrolet Silverado and 2014 GMC Sierra pickups, can cause the trucks to lose their electric power steering for just a second, but that can be enough to cause some serious headaches when we're talking about a two ton hunk of metal.
Educación	Despierta America	08/11/2017	4:00	In a survey of about 1,400 parents of public school children in kindergarten through eighth grade, Learning Heroes found that 9 in 10 parents believe their children are performing at or above grade level in math and reading. But results from the National Assessment of Educational Progress show that only about a third of them are. And while most parents have high expectations about their children going to college and doing well, only about 37 percent of graduates are prepared for college. Even among those parents who think their children struggle academically, most don't feel confident they could support their child's learning.
Economía	Despierta America	09/01/2017	0:25	Consumers should expect gas prices to raise even further, as much as 40 cents per gallon, due to supply shortages from Hurricane Harvey damage, according to energy experts. The national average for a gallon of regular gasoline has risen from about \$2.35 a week ago to \$2.45 now.
Economía/Seguridad	Despierta America	09/15/2017	2:30	At a congressional hearing last week, financial industry representatives pushed for legislation that would chip away at consumer protection rules governing the three major credit reporting bureaus. Loosening those regulations "would provide economic stability" by capping the industry's exposure to class-action claims, a trade group official testified. Hours later, one of the three bureaus, Equifax, disclosed a major data breach, which has potentially compromised the sensitive personal data of more than 143 million Americans. Capitol Hill is now demanding answers about the cyberattack. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, the Federal Trade Commission, and at least six state attorneys general have opened investigations. While authorities and consumers are calling for action, the push is unlikely to translate into new rules or legal curbs.

Generally, prescription formulas are taken by patients with severe conditions for long periods, while lower-dose over-the-counter formulas are approved for only short-term use by the US Food and Drug Administration. At prescription strength, proton-pump inhibitors are associated with a potential 25% increased risk of early death from any cause, suggests new research published Monday in the British Medical Journal Open.

If the missile were fired on a flatter, standard trajectory, it would have major US cities such as Los Angeles, Denver and Chicago well within its range, with the possible ability to reach as far as New York and Boston. President Donald Trump condemned the missile launch and said the United States would act to ensure its security.

The storm Thursday afternoon sent water gushing through a section of Acton, about 50 miles north of Los Angeles. Helicopter views showed streams of muddy brown water gushing around ranches, homes and cars, although no evacuations were called. Also, in less than 28 hours, Oklahoma has been pummeled by earthquakes. The wave started on Tuesday night, when five quakes struck the central part of the state, and extended into the early hours of Thursday as two more hit, according to the United States Geological Survey. All of the earthquakes were between magnitude two and five and no significant damage was reported.

If carried out, it would be the North's most provocative missile launch to date. The announcement Thursday warned that the North is finalizing a plan to fire four of its Hwasong-12 missiles over Japan and into waters around the tiny island, which hosts 7,000 U.S. military personnel on two main bases and has a population of 160,000. We speak to a veteran and military expert about the topic.

In southern Florida, residents faced life-altering damage and displacement that would prevent a return to normal life for some time. Many areas had fuel shortages, as well as downed power lines and standing water.
Salud/Política	Noticiero Univision	07/13/2017	1:59	Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) is fighting a two front war. At the right end of his caucus, hardliners want deep Medicaid cuts and weaker protections for people with preexisting conditions. More pragmatic conservatives, meanwhile, say they want to keep the legislation from working havoc on Medicaid. If a new version of the Senate Republican health bill is

				any indication, however, McConnell's strategy is to placate the hardliners and ignore the relatively moderate voices within his caucus. Though the new draft version of "Trumpcare", which was released on Thursday, does make some tweaks to the previous bill's approach to Medicaid, it largely leaves in place a plan that would eventually phase out Medicaid in its entirety. Medicaid serves nearly 75 million individuals, most of them drawn from very vulnerable populations such as the poor, the aged, and the disabled. The new "Trumpcare" bill, like the one McConnell released last month, imposes caps on Medicaid spending. And the caps effectively lose value with each passing year.
Salud/Seguridad	Noticiero Univision	07/23/2017	1:56	Experts say the United States might be squandering a quarter of the money spent on health care. That's an estimated \$765 billion a year. Do you believe you've encountered this waste? What if the system is destroying drugs that are technically "expired" but could still be safely used? Experts ran tests on the decades-old drugs, including some now defunct brands such as the diet pills Obocell (once pitched to doctors with a portly figurine called "Mr. Obocell") and Bamadex. Overall, the bottles contained 14 different compounds, including antihistamines, pain relievers and stimulants. All the drugs tested were in their original sealed containers. The findings surprised both researchers: A dozen of the 14 compounds were still as potent as they were when they were manufactured, some at almost 100 percent of their labeled concentrations.

Activists oppose claiming that they violate citizens' privacy and could be used for other espionage purposes, a group of protesters clamored loudly in front of the headquarters of the Los Angeles Police (LAPD), against that entity's plan to start using drones. "While the whole country is calling for an end to the militarization of the police, there is an effort to add military-style technology to the LAPD arsenal," the LAPD Coalition to Stop the Espionage said in a statement. The group protested yesterday in front of the headquarters of the law enforcement agency and during the meeting of the Police Commission. In fact, the protests became so heated, that the Commission had to dissolve its session to return later. The LAPD plan Assistant Chief Beatrice Girmala presented the plan to the Commission to start using the drones, a proposal that was first made three years ago, but was suspended in the face of public protests.
Seguridad/Clima	Noticiero Univision	08/25/2017	3:00	 Hurricane Harvey smashed into Texas late Friday, lashing a wide swath of the Gulf Coast with strong winds and torrential rain from the fiercest hurricane to hit the U.S. in more than a decade. The National Hurricane Center said the eye of the Category 4 hurricane made landfall about 10 p.m. about 30 miles (48 kilometers) northeast of Corpus Christi, bringing with it 130 mph (209 kph) sustained winds and flooding

				rains.Harvey's approach sent tens of thousands of residents fleeing the Gulf Coast, hoping to escape the wrath of a menacing storm that threatened an area of Texas including oil refineries, chemical plants and dangerously flood-prone Houston, the nation's fourth-largest city.Texas Gov. Greg Abbott warned that the monster system would be "a very major disaster," and the predictions drew fearful comparisons to Hurricane Katrina, one of the deadliest ever to strike the U.S.Reports of damage began to emerge from Rockport, a coastal city of about 10,000 people that was directly in the path of Harvey when it came ashore.
Seguridad/Clima	Noticiero Univision	09/06/2017	2:04	Hurricane Irma, one of the strongest storms ever recorded in the Atlantic, hit the eastern Caribbean on Wednesday with winds of up to 185 miles an hour, but had slowed to 180 m.p.h. by Thursday morning. The Category 5 storm leveled Barbuda, damaging 95 percent of its buildings and leaving the island "barely habitable." It has since begun lashing Puerto Rico and is also threatening havoc and destruction in the Virgin Islands, the Dominican Republic, Haiti and Cuba. The Bahamas and the Turks and Caicos Islands will also be at risk on Thursday. The French interior minister, Gerard Collomb, said at least eight people had been killed in French Caribbean territory, and at least three deaths were reported elsewhere. The authorities warned that the toll would rise as communications improved. President Trump declared a state of emergency in Florida, Puerto Rico and the United States Virgin Islands. The storm is expected to reach Florida early on Saturday, potentially causing catastrophic flooding.
