In the 3rd quarter of 2022, WIUP-FM continued to present a varied schedule of both recorded and live public information programming dealing with issues of national, regional and local interest.

WIUP-FM broadcasts the nationally syndicated news and current events program *Democracy Now!*, Monday through Friday from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. *Democracy Now!* is a national, daily, independent, award-winning news program hosted by award-winning journalists Amy Goodman and Juan Gonzalez. *Democracy Now!*'s War and Peace Report provides our audience with access to people and perspectives rarely heard in the US corporate-sponsored media, including independent and international journalists, ordinary people from around the world who are directly affected by US foreign policy, grassroots leaders and peace activists, artists, academics and independent analysts.

During a regularly scheduled public information programming hour – (Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. during the fall and spring semesters, 10am-11am in the summer) – WIUP presented an array of programs dealing with issues of interest to both the academic and non-academic communities we serve. These include US Politics, (*White House Chronicle*) regional environmental news (*The Allegheny Front*), recent publications in literature, scholarship, and nonfiction (*The Book Show*), media analysis and criticism (*Counterspin*, *The Media Project*), issues focusing on women (51%) and LGBTQIA (*This Way Out*) populations, as well as current research and public affairs (*The Best of Our Knowledge*, *Scholars' Circle*). Descriptions of the nature of each program and the topics covered follows in this document.

WIUP-FM broadcasts a minimum of twenty recorded public service announcements per broadcast day. These announcements benefit local, regional and national public service and information organizations and agencies. The complete audio cart listing of all our recorded Public Service Announcements is included within this document.

In addition to recorded public service announcements, WIUP-FM broadcasts twenty live-read announcements per broadcast day. A listing of the agencies and organizations served by these announcements is included within this document.

News about a global clean energy conference in Pittsburgh, pipelines, and spotted lanternflies.

Climate change is fueling more flooding in Pennsylvania and throughout the Ohio Valley. We'll look at the relationship between climate change, flooding and extreme weather. And we'll hear about how one town in Pennsylvania is trying to get ahead of the problem. Plus, it's the 60th anniversary of the publication of a book that questioned the indiscriminate use of synthetic chemicals and became an instant classic: Rachel Carson's "Silent Spring."

Street trees help cool cities, filter rainwater, and prevent flooding. We look at how Pennsylvania cities are overcoming barriers to planting more. In Huntington County, birders and naturalists oppose new development next to a wetland. PFAS, called forever chemicals, is the latest worry over fracking. We talk to a reporter about how PFAS found in one man's well water could have come from fracking. One year later, the impacts of Hurricane Ida linger for people in Pennsylvania. And, we talk with a conservationist about purple martins, which need human-made birdhouses to keep them from going extinct in the eastern U.S.

For those new to Pittsburgh, the realization that the air isn't always healthy to breathe can come as a shock. That's what happened to producer Susan Scott Peterson and her family. This is a special episode about the air we breathe, the risks we live with, and what it means to become a citizen of a place.

A new study finds children living near fracking sites in Pa. are at an increased risk of leukemia. Meanwhile, Energy Transfer is held criminally responsible for the damage done during the construction of its Mariner East pipeline. A high school student says we should thank the activists, not the politicians.

This week, we explore how tourism impacts local communities and their natural resources like the Canaan Valley in West Virginia. It's become a trendy tourist destination, which is good for business, but it's straining the resources of a county with just 7,000 year-round residents. We take a trip to Appalachia's Ice Mountain, where rare plants have existed since the Ice Age, and cool air seeps out of ice vents deep in the rocks. Plus, a conversation with Pennsylvania's first director of outdoor recreation.

We have a special show about Indigenous people, land, water, and culture. We look at how the pawpaw, a fruit that grows in the eastern US, continues to live in the memories and language of Indigenous people forced to move west. Plus, a paddler from the Seneca Nation takes a journey down the Allegheny River to draw attention to protecting waterways.

Our 1800th episode finds an eerie resemblance between the stories we reported the last week of September 1992 — fighting to secure state-level rights in Colorado and California ... and oh, that Florida — and today’s conservative trends.

And in NewsWrap: more than 10,000 opponents of queer rights march through the streets of Istanbul demanding a ban on “LGBTQ propaganda,” Roman Catholic bishops in Belgium defy the Vatican to authorize celebrations affirming same-gender couples, the U.S. Southern Baptist Convention cuts ties with two LGBTQ-welcoming congregations, the Mexican state of Durango gets marriage equality by gubernatorial decree, the U.S. state of Montana yields to an injunction blocking its ban on birth certificate gender changes, Tennessee’s Vanderbilt University Medical Center and Akron Children’s Hospital in Ohio come under fire because of their gender-affirming care programs for young people, a Texas judge expands her injunction to halt “child abuse” investigations into P-FLAG and other families of transgender youth, and more international LGBTQ news reported this week by Marcos Najera and M.R. Raquel (produced by Brian DeShazor).

State legislatures have traditionally controlled districting, with a decentralization of process and decision-making as to how they are drawn. And in recent years, technology has enabled a more complex system of gerrymandering that can challenge the principles of democracy. Indeed it could produce outcomes where the party with fewer votes has control of the democratic institution. How much have voting districts have been gerrymandered and how might it affect the upcoming elections? [dur:26mins]

Alaska's recent special election produced a rare win for a Democrat, rather than a Republican for the state's congressional seat. How much of it had to do with the voting process known as ranked-choice voting? Rank choice voting is meant to produce majoritarian outcomes in elections with multiple candidates. Scholars' Circle – Undoing of Separation between Church and State by SCOTUS – July 31, 2022

Thomas Jefferson once declared that the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution was intended to build a wall of separation between the church and state. Have the recent Supreme Court rulings eroded this purpose? And what do these ruling mean for the role of religion and lawmaking in the larger society across the United States? [dur: 58mins.]

Scholars' Circle – SCOTUS on the path to take back tribal sovereignty set in law by the US Congress – July 24, 2022

The US Supreme Court just challenged tribal sovereignty in its ruling in *Oklahoma v Castro-Huerta*, which empowers the state much greater power to prosecute for alleged crimes in tribal lands. The legal implications are vast. We will explore the case and the future of tribal sovereignty in light of the Court's drastic reversal of case precedent.

What does this case mean for the jurisdiction of the tribe on reservations and on child welfare under what's called the Indian Child Welfare Act, or ICWA? [dur: 58mins.]

Scholars' Circle – Regulatory challenges for EPA after *West Virginia v. EPA* Decision of 2022 – July 17, 2022

The Supreme Court has weakened executive agencies and their ability to regulate and make policy. No agency has been more affected than the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). What is next for environmental protection? [dur: 58mins.]

Traditionally, the US Supreme Court has given executive branch agencies such as the Environmental Protection Agency quite a bit of latitude at enforcing Congressional legislation. This principle is called Chevron deference. But in this term, the Supreme Court weakened this principle significantly, in particular in the area of environmental protection. In *West Virginia v EPA*, the Court signaled that the EPA can only enforce on areas specifically outlined by Congress. Specifically, it weakened the agency's ability to take regulatory steps to combat climate change. We will discuss what this means for the EPA, for public policy, and for the US's ability to make international commitments on the environment.

Scholars' Circle – We examine Post Roe world of Women's health care – July 10, 2022

Women have lost their constitutional right of bodily autonomy and the right to an abortion in the United States. We discuss the impact of the overturning of *Roe v Wade* with an emphasis on the future legal struggles, as well as, the social challenge of ensuring reproductive health and equality. How has the discourse around abortion shifted? What has altered about the way we think and talk about abortions and the right to abortions? We look at Crisis Pregnancy Centers and their impact. Also, we explore the role of the federal government. [dur: 58mins.]

Scholars' Circle – States' Rights to Legislate Gun Violence Restricted by SCOTUS – July 3, 2022

The US Supreme Court, in [New York State Rifle and Pistol Association v Bruen](#), ruled that state laws must reflect a Second Amendment protection that allows for individuals to carry guns for personal protection outside of their homes. We explore the impact of the proliferation of weapons in the United States. And we examine the future of gun control legislation in light of the Court's rejection of state power to restrict gun ownership to private homes and gun clubs, thus, restricting the legislator's ability to address gun violence.
