But there is a problem. If Congress had intended to define sexual orientation as a protected class under the law, it could have amended Title VII at any time. But it hasn't. Three weeks ago the Eleventh Circuit came to the opposite conclusion of the Seventh Circuit so the

issue is headed to the Supreme Court.

But while her actions were extraordinary, her belief that suffering is best dealt with by eliminating the sufferer isn't. Our culture is largely clueless about what gives life value and what gives us dignity. Because we don't know what a life worth living looks like, we don't know what a truly good death looks like, either."
