### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A: **Aging:** Second Wave Michigan reports that Michigan is preparing for a rapidly aging population. They say that "the state has more than 2 million residents over age 60, representing about 25% of the state's population, and 37% of Michigan residents are 50 and older. Michiganders 85 and older are the fastest-growing age group of all. The state also has one of the top 15 oldest populations in the U.S."
- B: **Employment.** Work patterns continue to change nearly three years into the pandemic. While views on hybrid schedules or the allowance of working from home have loosened, the feeling of having to work while you are sick is causing more stress.
- C: **Opioid Addiction:** The biggest drug bust in Michigan happened on March 23rd. Kent County investigators tipped the DEA off about the shipment heading their way, when the drugs arrived in metro Detroit, the DEA and local authorities were waiting. The DEA's Detroit office seized 20 kilograms (which is about 40 lbs) of Fentanyl which is enough to kill everyone in Michigan.
- D: **Disabilities:** According to the latest census, there are roughly 10 million residents in the State of Michigan with over 2.3 million adults suffering from some type of disability.
- E: **Tick Borne Diseases:** Lyme disease is the most common tick-borne disease in Michigan. Other rare diseases include: anaplasmosis, babesiosis, deer-tick virus, and ehrlichiosis. Tick borne diseases have been on the rise in Michigan since 1998.
