

2017 4th Quarter Public Affairs Programs and Community Issues aired on KLBB Radio

KLBB Radio serves its community with daily news programs and public service announcements. While our broadcast signal covers the entire Twin Cities metropolitan area, we focus on events in Washington County, MN and St. Croix County, WI. We have national and international news each hour from Fox Radio followed each day from 6 am to 8 pm with newscasts from Minnesota News Network. We do local and Twin Cities area news at the bottom of the hour from 7 am to 3:30 pm on weekdays. We also run 5 daily "community calendar" local events programs on weekdays along with the "Here's What's Happening" program on weekdays at 5:30 and 3 "community calendar" programs on Saturdays. Weekend community affairs programming includes "The Stan Turner Show" (political and entertainment news on Saturdays at noon), and "Access Minnesota" (current events, health and historic reporting produced by the Minnesota Broadcasters Association on Sundays at 7 am) KLBB also does a number of weekend community service programs such as "Voices in the Valley" from the Shire Literature Center features students from local high schools reading their literary works and interviewing authors. We also broadcast a number of programs created by local businesses and an advocacy program called "Education Nation" from the Liberty Classical Academy.
