## 01-03-24

Issue addressed: Food Banks

Program and host name: Rest and Relax with Eric Kallio

Start time of segment broadcast: 11:12 PM

**Duration of segment: 2 minutes** 

**Briefly detail the segment content, including the names of participants:** Eric Kallio informed listeners about the Vermont Department of Labor's increase of the state's minimum wage to \$13.67 per hour. The increase also affects tipped employees to \$6.84 per hour. The minimum wages are adjusted annually per Vermont state law. Reference made to the Vermont Department of Labor's website and phone number should an employee feel they are not being compensated fairly to the minimum wage law.

Issue addressed: NH & VT Presidential Primaries Program and host name: *Rise and Shine* with Eric Kallio Start time of segment broadcast: 7:16 AM Duration of segment: 8 minutes

**Briefly detail the segment content, including the names of participants:** Eric Kallio presented listeners with information about the Presidential Primaries in VT and NH. The VT Presidential Primary is scheduled for March 5 that will coincide with the Town Meeting process. There are requirements as it relates to gathering the necessary signatures and filing fees for major party candidates and no filing fee is required for independent party candidates. The nominated president and vice president candidates must be in to the VT SOS at least 65 days prior to the November 5 election. For New Hampshire, the Presidential Primary election is scheduled for January 23. The town supervisors must convene 6 to 13 days prior to the primary in order to work through the checklist. The supervisors must be available the day of the primary for voter registration even if the polls close to 7pm. January 26 is the date that candidates can request a recount if the votes are within 0.9 percent of the final counts.

**Briefly detail the segment content, including the names of participants:** Eric Kallio alerted listeners to information on the New Hampshire Department of Transportation website as it relates to the agency's snow removal process and ice removal on state roads. The website also recommends safe driving tips during snowstorms such as

slowing down, keeping distance from other drivers to stop in time and avoid sudden movements. Further recommendation to avoid crowding the snow plow during operations as well as staying behind it at a safe distance in order to benefit from the plow and salt/sand treatment of the road. Another important factors is to clear all snow and ice off the vehicle to avoid obstruction to seeing the road and wear the seatbelt at all times.

Issue addressed: NH Ice Fishing Regulations & Ice Safety Program and host name: *Rise & Shine* with Eric Kallio Start time of segment broadcast: 4:08 PM

# **Duration of segment: 6 minutes**

**Briefly detail the segment content, including the names of participants:** Eric Kallio provided listeners with information regarding Ice Fishing regulations found on the New Hampshire Wildlife website. The website advises that ice fishing can be feasible as early as December if the ice is safe. Regulations call for lake trout having a defined fishing season from Jan. 1 to Mar. 31. The regulations call for salmon to not be taken through the ice, but instead to cut the fishing line as close to the salmon's mouth as possible instead of removing the fish from the water. Safety information was also given such as checking the ice to ensure thickness, staying away from cracks. The regulations recommend to check for a minimum of 6 inch ice thickness for foot travel, 8-10 inches for ATV travel, and not to drive vehicles on the ice. If you fall in, lay arms on the unbroken ice, then kick hard to get back onto the ice.

**Briefly detail the segment content, including the names of participants:** Erin Petrie provided listeners with gardening suggestions and good ideas (both indoors and outdoors) to work on in the winter for our region. Indoor houseplant tips were provided, with suggestions for maximizing sunlight and humidity. The segment also shared suggestions for seeds to start indoors now (both for flowers and early vegetables), and work to do for outdoor perennials and fruit trees.
