The State Plant Board is taking public comments on an issue that has divided much of Arkansas's agriculture community. Proposed regulations for the use of dicamba from May to October have been published. The herbicide has been blamed in recent years for extensive damage to non-resistant crops. The state is proposing it be used soybean and cotton varieties that are resistant to dicamba. There would be a one-mile buffer zone around research stations, organic crops and non-resistant crops. Arkansas Agriculture Department spokesman Brett Dawson says a 30 day public comment period is now open.
