Arkansas Gov. Asa Hutchinson says the Trump Administration's plan to distribute the COVID-19 vaccine to states has fallen short. Beginning today (Mon) teachers and people over 70 years of age are now eligible to receive the vaccine in the state. Hutchinson, speaking on Fox News Sunday, admitted Arkansas does not have enough doses of the vaccine to cover those new groups.
