the Texarkana, Ark., Police Department has become one of the few agencies accredited by the Arkansas Association of Chiefs of Police.

Only 14 agencies are so recognized in the state.

Texarkana, Ark., city manager, mayor and city board will present the accreditation to the TAPD at the board meeting at 6 p.m. Tuesday at City Hall.

This award was presented to TAPD by the Gov. Asa Hutchinson during the Chief's Convention in Rogers in November 2018. These standards were carefully developed by Arkansas Law Enforcement Professionals to assist agencies in the efficient delivery of police service and the protection of the citizens the department serves, said Cpl. Kristi Bennett, spokeswoman for TAPD.
