Environment	Clearly, the biggest story impacting the tri-state area was a summer of extreme heat and drought. Some people died due to the heat. The weather severely impacted farmers and their crops. There were numerous brush fires. Then a sudden change—hurricane season came early, bringing with it rain, high winds and flooding and total devastation which will reach into the billions of dollars. Many residents lost all—homes and businesses.
Health	St. Louis encephalitis—an unexpected plague dropped out of the sky and on residents in New York and Connecticut—forcing authorities to setup a widespread spraying program to kill the mosquitoes responsible for several deaths and numerous hospitalizations.
Social	The untimely death of John F. Kennedy, Jr., his wife and sister-in-law in a plane crash stunned not only local residents, but also the world.
Education	<p>Social promotion is no more in the New York City School System. The Chancellor in one blow did away with a 30-year-old system that promoted kids despite failing grades.</p> <p>Later it was found that a number of students forced to attend summer school really didn't have to go. The testing service made grading mistakes not only in New York, but elsewhere across the nation.</p>
Government & Politics	<p>Political pundits believed that New Jersey Governor Christine Todd Whitman was a "shoo-in" for the US Senate. Whitman in a surprise move pulled out of the race.</p> <p>Everyone expected and they've not been disappointed in the ugly battle that has been brewing between "wanna' be Senator" Rudy Giuliani and the First Lady, Hillary Rodham Clinton.</p> <p>New York's Governor Pataki surprised those not in the know, by coming out in support of Giuliani. There had been bad blood between the two every since the mayor anointed Mario Cuomo as his</p>

	<p>choice for Governor. Cuomo lost and Pataki won.</p> <p>A big brouhaha between Giuliani and the Brooklyn Museum of Art over an art exhibit the mayor dislikes. The mayor has pulled the museum's funding and the directors are suing the city.</p>
Crime & Murder	<p>Police brutality continues to be a problem in tri-state area police departments.</p> <p>"Road rage"—this is a serious community problem with no resolutions in sight.</p>
Bias	<p>Racial profiling remained one of the top stories in New Jersey.. A new top cop has been brought in to shape up the troopers</p> <p>There appears to be an increased number of hate attacks on African Americans and Jews. Authorities can only react to each incident, but no resolution is in sight.</p>
Economy & Business	Homeowners got some bad news—mortgage rates jumped to 8 percent for the first time in two years. The question is—are the good times over?
Transportation	New York City is cracking down on motorists who "block the box." It will mean \$100 fine.
Legal	<p>Two New Jersey state troopers were indicted in the shooting of two African Americans and one Hispanic on the turnpike.</p> <p>The Abner Louima police brutality case is still knocking around. The cops who were convicted are trying to get the case overturned, claiming the courts have the wrong man.</p> <p>The Boy Scouts in New Jersey say they'll take their case to the Supreme Court, if necessary. A judge ruled that the Scouts cannot ban people from the organization just because they're gay.</p>

Religion	The big story was the unexpected illness of New York's John Cardinal O'Connor. A brain tumor was discovered and he was operated on. The Cardinal, however, is back on the job, but still under treatment.
Sports	A 17-year-old African American Serena Williams won the US Tennis Open, beating Martina Hingis who defeated Serena's older sister Venus Williams.

Many areas lost power, experienced serious water problems subway delays. One area of the city, Washington Heights was without power for days and residents vented their anger at a meeting. Con Edison is on the hot seat and being asked how could it have happened and lasted for such a long time. Some shopkeepers lost money, food and business. In Washington Heights, some of the affected businesses have been denied federal aid. The continued heat forced Rockland County, Westchester, Long Island, New York City and New Jersey to impose watering restrictions. A storm spawned a twister in New Suffolk and Hauppauge, Long Island and the area was devastated. Everyone was praying for rain, but no one knew that when it came that there would such a deluge, impacting motorists and commuters from the tri-state area. The Hurricane season came all too soon and officials on Fire Island, Long Island and Point Pleasant Beach, New Jersey made preparations. Dangerous riptides and rough surf due to Hurricane Dennis at Sea Bright, New Jersey and Jones Beach, Long Island. Then the tri-state area fell victim to what was left of Hurricane Floyd. Homes and businesses were flooded. There was loss of life. People had to be evacuated. A state of</p>
