### Description of how this issue was covered

East Los Angeles Station Detectives have been actively working on solving two Assault with Deadly Weapon investigations. The cases involve a single suspect striking two victims on two separate occasions without warning with a hammer-type weapon. The first assault occurred on Friday, March 25, 2016 in the 1400 block of South Bonnie Beach Place, unincorporated Los Angeles. The suspect walked up to the elderly male and, without any warning or provocation, struck him with a hammer type weapon. When the victim fell to the ground the suspect kicked the victim. The suspect then fled southbound Bonnie Beach Place and out of view. The suspect is described as a male Hispanic, 40 to 45 years old, between 5'10 and 6'00 tall, heavy set, wearing a straw hat and blue wind breaker-type jacket. The second assault took place on the same date few hours later, in the 4400 block of Triggs Street, unincorporated Los Angeles. In this incident, the victim was standing in front of a residence when without warning or provocation the suspect attacked a female adult. The suspect struck the victim with a hammer-like weapon several times about the head. The woman immediately fell to the ground and fell unconscious. The suspect fled in an unknown direction. Witnesses in this incident describe the suspect as a male in his mid-forties, approximately 240 pounds, 6'00 tall, wearing a black jacket and black pants. Both victims in these incidents were transported to local hospitals and are listed in serious condition. The investigations are on-going and there is no additional information at this time.

Saturday allowing ExxonMobil's Torrance refinery to exceed pollution limits as it resumes gasoline manufacturing, angering some residents who wonder why the agency is bothering with a public hearing at all. Moreover, even basic questions about the refinery restart — such as when it will occur and by how much emission limits will be exceeded — remain unavailable. ExxonMobil officials did not answer those questions sent to them via email, while South Coast Air Quality Management District officials were unavailable Thursday. AQMD officials have indicated they will provide a calculation of the excess emissions at the hearing set for 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday at Torrance City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd. The refinery has sat largely idle since the February 2015 explosion that state and federal investigators contend was caused by ExxonMobil's deliberate failure to fix equipment for almost a decade even though the company knew it could cause a life-threatening explosion. The blast literally rocked the community, sent plumes of industrial debris showering on neighborhoods and sent pump prices soaring statewide. But some residents are angry that the purpose of the meeting is to discuss a mutually agreed upon stipulated order by the AQMD and ExxonMobil allowing the company to move ahead with its dirtier-than-usual start-up of refinery operations.

Cloudy, brown water coming out of the taps at five elementary schools in South Los Angeles has raised safety concerns for officials. People have complained about the tap water conditions for weeks, and at some point 96th Street, Grape Street, Compton Avenue, Joyner and Flournoy elementary schools were only using bottled water. The matter was brought up during a Los Angeles City Council meeting Tuesday, and Councilman Marqueece Harris-Dawson said he hoped to get an explanation of what was behind the cloudy water. Marty Adams, assistant general manager for the DWP, said a chlorine pump failure at the 99th Street wells back in January caused water to go into the system without being disinfected. Sediment in the water might also be causing it to have the cloudy color. Adams says he's not sure what the source of the sediment is, but that complaints started coming in from Watts in February, after a fire hydrant in the area broke. During the city council meeting Adams said that agency officials are looking into what the problem is and are doing everything they can to flush the pipes in the area. He added that the tap water is safe to drink. "We will flush all the sediments out and we're not going to stop until the problem is resolved," Adams said. Residents spoke to KTLA about water quality problems that have been taking place in the area for years. Some residents are complaining that the DWP only notified them with a letter of the chlorine pump problem in April, even though it actually happened in January.

A shooting at UCLA Wednesday morning that prompted an hours-long tactical search was determined to be a murder-suicide, LAPD Chief Charlie Beck said. He said many questions remain unanswered, but the campus is safe. Classes were canceled for the day and are expected to resume Monday. No other injuries were reported at the school. The shooting occurred about 10 a.m. in a small office in the Engineering IV building where two men were found dead, Beck said. A firearm was recovered at the scene. The men have not been identified, but police believe, based on the appearances of the victims, that a professor may have been shot by someone young enough to be a student, a law enforcement source told the Los Angeles Times. Los Angeles City Councilman Paul Koretz told a KTLA reporter that the victim appears to have been a professor.

An out-of-control, wind-driven wildfire burning in the Lake Isabella area of Kern County has left two people dead, destroyed about 80 homes and has grown to more than 19,000 acres in less than a day, authorities said Friday. The two fatalities were confirmed by the Kern County Fire Department about noon Friday. No information on the deaths was available, and the department said firefighters were still "engaged in firefighting operations and are beginning the damage assessment process." Dubbed the Erskine Fire, the blaze had burned about 19,034 acres and destroyed close to 100 structures, with an additional 1,500 threatened, the federal InciWeb information page stated about 10:15 a.m. Friday. The blaze started about 4 p.m. Thursday, and had burned nearly 30 square miles in 18 hours. Before the acreage was updated, authorities had said the fire was at 8,000 acres earlier Friday morning

A deadly wildfire in the Lake Isabella area of Kern County has burned down some 150 structures and was threatening about 1,500 others as firefighters frantically worked Saturday to contain the out-of-control inferno. Less than two days after erupting, the Erskine Fire has left a path of destruction and devastation in its wake, charring nearly 56 square miles of the Southern Sierra Nevada and prompting the evacuations of numerous local residents, according to the federal InciWeb information page. The blaze went from 5 percent containment Friday to 0 percent containment Saturday, according to a tweet from Cal Fire Chief of Public Information Daniel Berlant. Two people, a man and a woman, died in the fire, the Kern County Fire Department said Friday around noon.

### Description of how this issue was covered

In a dramatic ruling, the Supreme Court on Monday threw out a Texas abortion access law in a victory to supporters of abortion rights who argued it would have shuttered all but a handful of clinics in the state. The 5-3 ruling is the most significant decision from the Supreme Court on abortion in two decades and could serve to deter other states from passing so-called "clinic shutdown" laws. In joining with the liberal justices, perennial swing vote Justice Anthony Kennedy helped deliver a victory to abortion rights activists and signaled the court's majority in their favor could continue regardless of the presidential election and the filling of the empty seat on the bench left by the death of conservative Justice Antonin Scalia.
