David Carroll	WRCB, in partnership with the Chattanooga Times Free Press and WTCI-PBS, broadcast a town hall meeting on May 19, 2012 at 7:00pm called "The Bully Battle: A Town Hall Meeting" (re-aired on June 22, 2013 at 1:00 pm). More than 100 community members gathered for the discussion moderated by WRCB's David Carroll and Cindy Sexton. Roger Dinwiddie, president of the International Bullying Prevention Association, participated as a member of the panel. Also included on the panel were David and Tina Long from Chatsworth, Georgia. The Long's are featured in the new film, "Bully", after their son Tyler committed suicide following years of bullying. The remaining members of the expert panel included Karen Glenn, Executive Director Hamilton County S.T.A.R.S. (Students Taking A Right Stand); Lt. Shaun Shepherd, School Resource Officer Administrator; and Oran Dixson, Student Body President, East Ridge High School. The purpose of the program was to educate both children and adults about the serious repercussions of bullying and resources available to help curb bullying.
