## Quarterly Report on Community Issues Broadcasting For Quarter dated January 1, 2018 through March 31, 2018

The following program is a weekly broadcast provided as timely and pertinent information or the community needs of Nashville, Illinois. The program below is specifically programmed for its representation of issues and information which we, at WNSV-FM, have ascertained as significant to the daily living of the citizens of the community of Nashville, Illinois. We have chosen to provide this broadcasting as a public service of this radio station to its city of license.

**Sunday, January 7, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes talk to state Rep. Peter Breen, R-Lombard and special counsel for the Thomas More Society, about legal challenges to the state's public funding for elective abortions. They also discuss Illinois' staggering out-migration numbers, which dropped Illinois behind Pennsylvania as the nation's sixth-largest state.

**Sunday, January 14, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes discuss a developing feud between House Minority Leader Jim Durkin and a village he represents. They also talk to state Rep. David McSweeney, R-Barrington Hills, about efforts to consolidate government and lower property taxes throughout the state. And Proft and Hughes analyze Gov. Bruce Rauner's decision to stay at the Illinois Veterans' Home in Quincy.

**Sunday, January 21, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes talk to gubernatorial candidate and state Rep. Jeanne Ives, R-Wheaton, about momentum in her campaign against incumbent governor Bruce Rauner. They also discuss how Illinois' bordering states are benefitting from the Land of Lincoln's high property taxes, and how one Wisconsin town is especially reaping the benefits. And they discuss J.B. Pritzker's host of tax hike proposals.

**Sunday, January 28, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes break down how the 2017 income tax hike has hurt jobs growth in the state, and they talk to one Republican candidate looking to defeat a state representative who voted for the tax hike. They also discuss the possibility that yet another tax hike could be on the horizon for Illinoisans – thanks to Gov. Bruce Rauner's state schools superintendent. And they react to the first Democratic gubernatorial debate.

**Sunday, February 4, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes discuss Illinois' crushing property taxes and legislative candidates' approach to them. They also recap Gov. Bruce Rauner's State of the State Address, and talk about the growing number of state lawmakers opting to endorse state Rep. Jeanne Ives over Rauner.

**Sunday, February 11, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Pat Hughes and Joe Kaiser discuss the intensifying campaign season, which includes controversy brewing over taped conversations between JB Pritzker and former Gov. Rod Blagojevich.

**Sunday, February 18, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes discuss the sexual harassment allegations in House Speaker Mike Madigan's office that Madigan and Chicago Alderman Marty Quinn largely ignored. They also talk to the National Review writer who now famously dubbed Gov. Bruce Rauner the "worst Republican governor" in the country.

**Sunday, February 25, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Local Labs CEO Brian Timpone discuss how conservative state lawmakers are pushing back against Gov. Bruce Rauner. They also talk to a candidate for state representative in Metro East who believes his opponent is having a private investigator follow him and his wife. And they discuss what might happen now with Republicans and Democrats alike upset with House Speaker Mike Madigan's handling of sexual harassment allegations.

**Sunday, March 4, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes discuss with Jacob Huebert, the Liberty Justice Center director of litigation, the U.S. Supreme Court case that could end the forced payment of union dues throughout the country. They also talk to filmmaker Eli Steele about his new film "How Jack Became Black" about identity politics.

**Sunday, March 11, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Pat Hughes and Brian Timpone discuss leaked emails from Gov. Bruce Rauner's office, and talk to a legislative candidate focused on rolling back the 2017 32 percent tax increase. They also discuss a new proposal in Springfield that would raise taxes on everyone making \$17,300 and up.

**Sunday, March 18, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Pat Hughes discuss legislative races coming this Tuesday, as well as the importance of focusing on Illinois' property tax burden in this coming election. Proft also discusses with Local Labs CEO Brian Timpone the possibility that Mike Madigan could be forced into resignation over sexual harassment allegations in his office.

**Sunday, March 25, 2018: Illinois Rising (28 minutes):** Dan Proft and Local Labs CEO Brian Timpone discuss the results of the March 20 primary and provide analysis of what voters can expect moving forward to the general election.
