SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS

Spring is a critical time to keep listeners informed about severe weather. Listeners need to be made aware immediately of severe storms so they can make the proper preparations.

RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

WXCM utilizes the services of media partner 14WFIE out of Evansville for severe weather coverage. When a warning is issued and the storm is bad enough for wall-to-wall coverage from the television station, all Cromwell stations simulcast the 14WFIE signal until the threat passes.

Several times a quarter. Some lengths exceed 30 minutes.

DIABETES AWARENESS

Within the WXCM listening area, there are many citizens suffering from diabetes. The Daviess County Diabetes Coalition, or DCDC, strives to educate the public about the disease.

RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

WXCM ran many announcements from the DCDC regarding the Diabetes Alert Day, a nationwide effort to get citizens to get tested to see if they are at risk for Type 2 Diabetes.

Several times a day from March 1 through March 28. 30 seconds each.

MAKE A WISH FOUNDATION

Children suffering from sickness and disease are given one-ofa-kind opportunities through Make a Wish Foundation. Events are held around the country to raise funding for the organization.

RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

WXCM, along with Book and Music Exchange, is helping to present "Rayal Resurrection," a wrestling event from Universal Championship Wrestling. It will be held April 15 at the Owensboro Sportscenter, and a portion of the proceeds will benefit Make a Wish.

Several announcements per day, beginning 3/23. 90 seconds each.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

Owensboro, as in any medium sized city, has its share of crime. Many witnesses are reluctant to come forward with tips to help solve crimes and lead to convictions. The Owensboro Police Department has a program that offers an incentive to come forward.

RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

Several times a quarter, OPD Officer Michael Hathaway updates the Crimestoppers Tip of the Week. Citizens could receive a cash reward for offering tips that lead to arrests. Callers can remain anonymous.

One minute each throughout quarter. Continually updated.

FEED SENIORS NOW

Around 2000 senior citizens in the United States die of malnutrtition every year. It's important that citizens take care of our older population and make sure they are staying fed and healthy.

RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

WXCM, along with Independence Bank, Comfort Keepers, and the Green River Area Development District, started promoting Feed Seniors Now, a program that is collecting donations of non-perishable food items to be given to seniors. The program runs through April 24.

Several times a day, live and recorded announcements. Average one minute. Began March 27.
