January 2, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Dr. Jeanne Marrazzo, director of the Division of Infectious Diseases at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), and Sean Tucker, Ph.D., the founder of Vaxart, whose company is developing a COVID vaccine pill, about the latest surge in coronavirus cases, the Omicron variant, and the future of vaccines for Gray TV's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, January 2, 2022.

Dr. Marrazzo told Van Susteren the current surge in COVID cases can be attributed to "a combination of holiday gatherings, being inside during cold weather, waning immunity, and now this crazy Omicron variant."

Still, Marrazzo said, she does not believe this cycle will continue indefinitely. "What I think will happen is that we will have progressive waves like this, and with increasing vaccination rates, with catching up as new variants emerge, with new vaccines – I'm sorry to say that I think more vaccines are in our future – the hope is that every single wave will have a lower height in terms of serious problems. So it'll become more like a seasonal flu or a seasonal cold."

Marrazzo also said there were some signs of emerging herd immunity, explaining: "One of the reasons that we think that the northern part of the country right now is having higher rates of infection while the southern part ... is that we had such a horrible summer with Delta that we now have a fair amount of herd immunity in the southern part of the United States."

And Marrazzo expressed hope over new vaccine technologies focusing on spike proteins, saying they "are going to be interesting and very promising in the coming months, and they potentially could be modified very quickly if new variants emerge."

Dr. Sean Tucker, whose company is developing a COVID vaccine pill he promises will be easier to store and distribute than injectables, says an oral vaccine could sway people who haven't gotten the shot because they don't like, or have a fear of, needles.

"We did a survey and just asked the question: If you had a pill vaccine versus a shot, which would you rather take? And seven out of 10 people said, 'Hey, we would take the pill over the shot.' And then even people that were reluctant to take a COVID vaccine at all, 25% of Americans ... We found a third of those would take the vaccine if it was given in a pill."

January 9, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Dr. Joseph Kanter, the State Health Officer of Louisiana, and Dr. Mikael Dolsten, Pfizer's Chief Scientific Officer, about COVID, the omicron variant, antivirals, and vaccines for Gray TV's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, January 9, 2022. The program will also feature a discussion with WWSB-TV (Sarasota, Fla.) reporter Daniela Hurtado.

Dr. Joseph Kanter told Van Susteren that Louisiana is seeing a record number of COVID cases; and, he said, even though omicron infections have been milder than those caused by the delta variant, "we're not letting our guard down."

When asked how hospitals are coping, Dr. Kanter answered that it has been hard to retain and recruit staff. "The biggest limiting factor for our hospitals ... It's not physical beds, it's not ventilators, it's not PPE right now. It's just keeping enough qualified staff on board."

On vaccine mandates, Dr. Kanter said: "These mandates, on some degree, distract the conversation because we're talking about the political side and we're not talking about why it's important to get vaccinated." And on the CDC's messaging surrounding COVID, he said: "There's clearly been bumps in the road in terms of communication."

Pfizer's Chief Scientific Officer Dr. Mikael Dolsten explained his company's new oral antiviral, Paxlovid, "was designed to, by purpose, get into the cell and interfere very early with those vicious plans of the virus to take over our cell." He predicted the medication would be "durable" and work against forthcoming variants. When asked about the Pfizer vaccine and the potential need for another booster – a fourth shot – Dolsten said: "We are seeing data that is encouraging that it may add value."

January 16, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Rep. Jim Clyburn (D-S.C.), the House Majority Whip, about President Biden's performance, voting rights legislation, the 2022 midterms, and the legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr. for Gray TV's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, January 16, 2022. The program will also feature a discussion with Washington Post White House reporter Annie Linskey.

"I can tell you the majority of the Black people I talk to are upset about voting, and if they're polled, they would express that position," Rep. Clyburn told Van Susteren when asked about President Biden's approval numbers.

On why high-profile members of the Black community, including Georgia gubernatorial candidate Stacey Abrams, did not attend the president's voting rights speech in Atlanta, the Democratic Whip attributed the absences to disappointment over voting rights and the Build Back Better Act. "When we do both things, those numbers will improve," said Clyburn, referring back to the president's poll numbers.

On whether he was concerned Democrats would lose control of the House of Representatives in the midterms, Clyburn said: "Sure, I'm worried about losing the House. I'm worried about losing this democracy. That's why I'm fighting as hard as I can for this voting rights bill, because we are teetering on the edge of losing this democracy."

And on Senators Kyrsten Sinema and Joe Manchin's refusal to end the filibuster to pass voting rights legislation, Clyburn said: "What we see now is the fact that the Democratic party is not 100% behind this president," adding that any Democrat not working to overturn recent voting restrictions is "supporting a reestablishment of Jim Crow."

January 23, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Sen. Roger Wicker (R-Miss.) and Sen. Chris Coons (D-Del.) about Russia, Ukraine, and President Biden for Gray TV's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, January 23, 2022.

On President Biden's comments this week suggesting the response to a Russian invasion of Ukraine would be different it were a "minor incursion," Sen. Wicker said: "I can tell you from private conversations that I had on the floor of the Senate shortly after the president's press conference, there was distress among Democrats and Republicans about what the president had said. We know that it was a misstatement of American policy ... a gaffe. And I guess we all do that. These are all too common in the Biden White House."

"Let me say what I think is the clear position," continued Wicker. "Any incursion by the Russian army into the sovereign territory of Ukraine will be met with very serious repercussions, and that would include economic sanctions of the severest kind."

The Senator said Republicans and Democrats were unified on the issue: "We are sending a strong bipartisan, nonpartisan message that this threat better not happen."

"President Biden was in no way giving Vladimir Putin a green light to invade or occupy Ukraine," said Sen. Chris Coons of the commander in chief's comments. "What I think it was referring to was that there is a disagreement with some of our allies about what minor actions by Russia count as an act of war."

On President Putin, Coons said: "I think he needs to de-escalate, and we need to find a way to move forward diplomatically without violence and without an invasion of Ukraine. I think President Biden's doing a strong job of deterring Putin."

Asked whether the President should hold another summit with Putin, Coons answered: "Biden communicated in person with Putin early in his presidency, on his first trip to Europe, to lay out some clear expectations about what we would do ... I do think a similar conversation to the extent it could lead to a diplomatic off-ramp for this confrontation would be constructive."

January 30, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Leon Panetta, who served as director of the CIA and secretary of defense under President Barack Obama, and current Pentagon spokesman John Kirby, a retired rear admiral in the United States Navy, for Gray TV's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, January 30, 2022.

When asked about the severity of the standoff between Russia and Ukraine, Mr. Panetta answered: "It's one of those moments in time when you're not quite sure what direction this could go in, and one direction involves war."

The former secretary of defense also said there was a possibility the situation could end peacefully, telling Van Susteren: "Putin is a bully, but he's not stupid ... And I think there's some room here if we have some smart negotiators and if Russia has some smart negotiators to be able to find some areas that I think both sides could agree to."

"His [Putin's] Achilles heel is that ultimately he does have to worry about the future of Russia," continued Panetta. "And if he does something stupid ... he'll pay a price and his legacy will pay a price."

On the risk to American lives, Panetta said that although President Biden has said there will be no boots on the ground, "Let's face it, right now there are military advisors, U.S. military advisors in the Ukraine working with the Ukrainians to try to develop their capabilities. And so if something happens, there's no question that U.S. lives are also going to be at stake here."

"It's really unclear what Mr. Putin has in mind," said Pentagon spokesman John Kirby. "We do believe that at this point he still has not made a decision about whether to launch another invasion or an incursion of any size into Ukraine." He added: "We still believe there's time and space for diplomacy to work. And we hope that that's the path forward here."

Kirby told Van Susteren that both Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Mark Milley and Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin have spoken to their Russian counterparts in recent weeks. "The question is how much do all those individuals really influence Vladimir Putin and what is he really thinking?" said Kirby. "Again, we don't think he's made a final decision, but he certainly is creating options for himself that could spell real trouble for the people of Ukraine."

February 6, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Sen. Mark Warner (D-Va.), the chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, about Russia, China, North Korea, and Iran, for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, February 6, 2022. The program will also feature a discussion with Gray TV White House correspondent and senior national editor Jon Decker.

Sen. Warner lauded President Biden for his actions on Russia, saying, "I will be the first to criticize the Biden Administration on many things, but on rallying NATO against the Russian threat in Ukraine, I think they've done a pretty good job."

"I think we have got [Russian President Vladimir] Putin a little bit back on his heels," he continued. "The fact that Putin believed initially that NATO would not rally and that Ukrainians might even welcome Russian intervention, I think he's been disabused of those notions."

Warner predicted Putin would not move forward with an invasion of Ukraine during the Olympics and said that because of Russia's "old military technology" the window for action was likely from the middle of February to the middle of March. "Unless the ground is frozen, the Russian tanks can't proceed into Ukraine. That thawing takes place in the middle of March," he said.

Warner also suggested Putin had not fully thought out the consequences of an incursion. "I think from the intelligence standpoint, we are afraid that he's not been hearing enough reality. I mean you invade, but how can you occupy a country of Ukraine's size with cities like Kyiv that are four-million-plus people?"

On Chinese spying operations in the U.S., Warner said "It really is extraordinarily extensive ... they're stealing huge amounts of intellectual property." The chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee added that "it's really been hard over the last few years to convince American business and American academic institutions of this threat."

And on the House's recent passage of the America COMPETES Act, Warner said: "Oh my gosh ... This was such a fricking no-brainer. I mean, we [the Senate] passed this bill last summer with 69 votes."

"This is long overdue," he continued. "Thank God the House has finally acted. We're going to still have to get to a conference report because I'm not sure the House bill could pass the Senate in a bipartisan way. But we will get this done."

February 13, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Rep. Debbie Dingell (D-Mich.) about the water quality in America for a special episode of Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, February 13, 2022. The program will also feature a conversation with Andrew Freedman, a climate and energy reporter for Axios.

When asked whether people across the country should question the quality of their drinking water, Rep. Dingell answered: "They should."

"We have PFAS in our water. PFAS is a forever chemical," continued Dingell. "More than 98% of the American people have some level of PFAS in their blood ... People need to be asking questions and there are things we need to be doing at the national level like setting a PFAS standard for drinking water and removing the lead in every water pipe across this country."

Rep. Dingell admitted to Van Susteren that she had butted heads with the Biden administration over the importance of access to clean water, particularly during the COVID pandemic.

"Look, I'll be blunt. I had a fight with the White House," said Dingell. "I think that people having a house to live in is important, and when the CDC declared evictions a national health priority that was important, but isn't having access to clean water, both to clean your hands and to drink, even more important? And we couldn't get the CDC to make that, fighting that everybody should have access to clean water."

"I think people have a right to expect it," she added. "I think it's a human right. You need water to live."

February 20, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Austan Goolsbee, the former chairman of the White House Council of Economic Advisers under President Barack Obama and professor of economics at the University Of Chicago Booth School of Business, and Ron Fong, president and CEO of the California Grocers Association, about inflation, interest rates, and supply chain issues for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, February 20, 2022.

Mr. Goolsbee told Van Susteren he did not agree with Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell's recent statement that inflation is a severe threat to the job market. "In a way, it's a reflection of the strength of the job market," countered Goolsbee, "But I do think it's a threat to, let's call it a stable expansion, and a threat that the Fed might raise the interest rates a whole lot, could send us back into recession sometime."

Goolsbee also said: "The interest rate is not going to be zero forever. They should start raising rates. The question is, there are now people arguing they should raise rates eight times this year. And I just want to caution everybody, you can definitely go too far. We learned that from the 1970s."

When asked how the government could identify the cause of inflation, whether it be a supply chain issue or due to monetary policy, to in turn find a solution, the economist replied: "It's not an answer that you're going to want to hear. It's certainly not the answer the White House wants to hear, and that is let's sit here for a few months and wait for the data to come in."

Ron Fong told Van Susteren that supply shortages and labor issues go hand in hand. "You cannot talk about a supply chain problem without talking about the labor shortages," he said.

Fong predicted relief in the future. "The supply chain will repair itself. It will get to the grocery stores quicker and hopefully the prices will come down, and we will pass those savings back down to the consumers."

February 27, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Rep. Jake Auchincloss (D-Mass.), a former Marine who served in Afghanistan, about Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the impact on the United States, President Biden's State of the Union address, and the future of the Democratic party for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, February 27, 2022. The program will also feature a discussion with Gray TV White House correspondent and senior national editor Jon Decker.

On Russia's military invasion of Ukraine, Rep. Auchincloss said "President Putin has made a historic mistake. He has done more to unify NATO after the depredations of the Trump years than anything that could have happened in the West."

When asked his advice on dealing with the crisis, the former Marine platoon commander said President Biden and NATO allies should not only sanction Russia, but also provide significant lethal and non-lethal aid to Ukrainian insurgents, wage information campaigns to show the Russian people "that their President is imbalanced and hallucinogenic and that he is going to severely lower their standard of living," and "crush" the Russian oil and gas sector. "No more should the world be reliant upon Russian energy exports," he added.

On President Biden's upcoming State of the Union address and the challenges of addressing a divided country, Auchincloss said: "We have gotten the economy reopened, created more jobs in one year than in any other previous administration. But, of course, we still have problems. Of course, we still have divisiveness, especially when the former President is out there rooting for Vladimir Putin right now ... Hard to be unified with a wing of the GOP that is actively rooting for a maniacal dictator to invade a sovereign democracy."

March 6, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Sen. Rick Scott (R-Fla.), chairman of the National Republican Senatorial Committee (NRSC), and Nina Khrushcheva, professor of international affairs at The New School and the great-granddaughter of former Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev, for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, March 6, 2022.

Sen. Scott called Russian President Vladimir Putin "a murderous thug" for his actions against Ukraine, and said: "I hope the Biden administration will do everything they can to make sure we just absolutely cripple the Russian economy because I think unfortunately that's the only way we're going to stop this." Scott also criticized President Biden for not having done enough to deter Putin.

When asked whether he would be willing to put U.S. troops on the ground in Ukraine, Sen. Scott answered: "You should always keep all your options open ...I don't think you should ever take it off the table."

On Putin's nuclear threat, Scott said: "I hope that Putin and the military leaders in Russia are not crazy enough to basically kill an unbelievable number of people as a result of a nuclear weapon ... but I think what you have to look at, always take people for their word. If they're threatening you, you better listen to them. And so I

think we've got to do everything we can to make sure that doesn't happen. But appeasement's not an answer."

Nina Khrushcheva, who co-authored the book "In Putin's Footsteps: Searching For The Soul Of An Empire Across Russia's Eleven Time Zones," told Van Susteren that her great-grandfather, former Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev "would be appalled" by Putin's actions, adding that the former Soviet leader "loved Ukraine and ... he never thought that Russia is superior to Ukraine."

Khrushcheva said that Putin's brutality is no surprise. "It's not that he suddenly woke up and became that bad ... It is just an increase of brutal tactics that before he would use in certain instances, but much smaller instances. And now he just went full-blown dictatorship."

March 13, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed House Minority Whip Steve Scalise (R-La.) and Rev. Franklin Graham, president and CEO of the humanitarian relief organization Samaritan's Purse, about the Russia-Ukraine war for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, March 13, 2022.

Rep. Scalise repeatedly expressed his view that the Biden administration and NATO allies need to send military equipment, including fighter jets, to Ukrainian forces. "This isn't the time to be worried about Putin's feelings," he said. "It's time to be helping the people of Ukraine, get them the relief they need quickly. They don't have days and weeks to have President Biden dithering around."

"While the world's galvanized behind Zelensky and the people of Ukraine, you can't just leave them out there fighting with broomsticks," continued the House Minority Whip, adding: "We've got to get them all the things that they're asking for ... do everything possible to get those MiGs into Ukraine. Don't find excuses. Find a way to get it done."

Rev. Franklin Graham, whose humanitarian organization Samaritan's Purse erected a field hospital in Lviv, Ukraine near the Polish border, told Van Susteren that "it's just a chaos at the border with tens of thousands of people trying to cross every hour."

March 20, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Yuriy Sak, an adviser to the Ukrainian Minister of Defense, and Sen. Tim Kaine (D-Va.), a member of the Senate Armed Services and Foreign Relations Committees, about the Russia-Ukraine war for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, March 20, 2022.

Yuriv Sak likened Russian troops to Nazis, saying, "They're acting like cowards ... They're throwing bombs at kindergartens. They're throwing bombs at shelters." Sak called Russia's actions against civilians "war crimes" and said he was "convinced that a day will come when every single person responsible for this war will be brought to justice."

"This is not just a Ukrainian problem," he added. "We are dealing with a deranged regime who is capable of ruining the whole continent and it needs to be stopped." On the mindset of Ukraine's political and military leadership, Sak said: "They're tough cookies. They're determined to win. They're determined to save Ukraine."

Sen. Tim Kaine called Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's address to Congress this week "Extremely powerful," adding: "There was a bipartisan sense ... that we need to keep doing more." On Zelensky's

continued request for a no-fly zone over Ukraine, Kaine said: "I don't think the right answer is to put U.S. troops either on the ground in Ukraine or in the air over Ukraine, because that would, in all likelihood, lead to an escalation of this war beyond Ukraine. So, a U.S. or NATO enforced no-fly zone likely is not going to happen."

Still, Kaine told Van Susteren he was "very open" to providing air platforms to Ukraine. "I think there is some difference of opinion. I have some colleagues who are worried about delivery of air platforms could provoke Putin, but he was born provoked."

"We and our allies have to deliver to Ukraine a quantity and a lethality of weaponry that they can use immediately to defend their country," he said.

March 27, 2022

Greta Van Susteren interviewed Rep. Sara Jacobs (D-Calif.), a member of the House Armed Services and Foreign Affairs Committees, and Oleksandra Matviychuk, a Kyiv-based human rights lawyer and the chairwoman of the Center for Civil Liberties, about the Russia-Ukraine war for Gray Television's "Full Court Press with Greta Van Susteren" airing Sunday, March 27, 2022.

Congresswoman Sara Jacobs told Van Susteren she believes "it's a very real possibility" that Russian President Vladimir Putin will use chemical weapons in his war against Ukraine. "I would be very concerned that as he continues to see battlefield losses, that he would think to resort to chemical weapons," she said.

"The increased weapons assistance that we are sending to Ukraine is very important in this regard," continued Rep. Jacobs. "I support getting them an air defense system like the S300 that will help in shooting down some of the potential delivery systems for those chemical weapons."

When asked about President Biden's announcement that the U.S. will take in up to 100,000 refugees and provide a billion dollars in humanitarian assistance, Jacobs answered that president's actions were "a really important step" but said: "There are many other places in the world that are experiencing conflict as well ... So I think that it's important, actually, that we lift the refugee cap, that we end Title 42, and that we work to make the United States a welcoming place for anyone who is fleeing conflict from anywhere."

Kyiv-based human rights lawyer Oleksandra Matviychuk told Van Susteren she has rebuffed multiple pleas from international partners for her to leave the embattled Ukrainian city with the same answer: "Don't ask me to retreat. Please help us to resist."

On Putin's motives, Matviychuk said "he thinks very practically," explaining her belief that because he was not punished by the international community for his actions in Chechnya, Moldova, Georgia and Syria, that he will "go further and further."

"Ukraine is not only his goal," continued Matviychuk. "If we will not be able to stop Putin in Ukraine, he will go further and it's only a matter of time which next country will be a target."
