## **Under the Helmet #20**

January 5, 2002

Back in the Day--Deuce Staley of the Philadelphia Eagles began playing football as a young boy. He was always very small; the big kids were always trying to hit him really hard and beat him up. He learned to run away from them. He only played two years of football in high school. The fade pattern was a favorite play inside the 20 yard line. Inside the ten, they gave him the ball, and he would dive over the top for the touchdown. He used a move he called the "dead leg"-he would stick out his leg and look like he was going to stay there. It worked in high school, but Deuce says that this move will get you hurt in the NFL.

**Educational Theme: Do not let your size keep you from reaching your dream.**

Marshall Arts in the NFL--David Akers, field goal kicker for the Philadelphia Eagles, is into the Marshall Arts. The segment showed a demonstration of Brazilian Jui-Jitsu. One of the key concepts is "it is always peace over war." The warm-ups alone look like a difficult workout. Akers says that the warm-ups are the worst part of the class. He sees the arts as an excellent training tool; it also builds confidence that he can use in a self defense situation or in a football game. 95% of all real fights end up on the ground, so they focus their training there. They demonstrated the front end step kick and the stepping stool kick. Even his surprise onside kick is similar to a marshall arts kick.

Terrell Owens Interview--Terrell Owens of the San Francisco 49ers was interviewed by a high school receiver from Berkeley High School. Owens spoke of the essentials of being a wide receiver. For the wide receiver, it all begins with the hands. When the ball is coming at you, catch the ball with the hands together, thumb to thumb. When asked about his greatest strength as a receiver, Owens claimed that his strength, literally, is his greatest strength. His strength helps him a lot, especially in a bump situation. Owens likes to freeze the defender at the line of scrimmage, release, and run the route.

Ahman Green--Back in the Day--Green of the Green Bay Packers grew up in Nebraska. He played both running back and linebacker. The NFL running back actually liked playing linebacker the most in high school. Early in his career, Green learned not to be scared of tacklers; he says that he needs to be ready to give out contact. His favorite play was called the "counter trey." Green's boyhood idol was Walter Payton. Ahman learned from Payton the stiff arm and to drive the legs after contact. Green attributes much of his success to working very hard.

She went to him seeking guidance on leadership and how to turn a team around when experiencing a difficult season. One of his comments was quite profound: “You can only do what you can do.” Often we expect too much of ourselves and we then “beat ourselves up over things that are out of our control.” He also spoke about balancing the different needs and wants of rookies and veteran players. Mariucci described the four types of leaders that work on his team. The coach also emphasized maintaining an element of fun in the game of football, even for the experienced professional. Chastain ended the segment with a comment on success. She said, “You don’t have to be perfect to win a championship—you just have to grow and learn together.”
