Willcox families are participating in the world's largest Christmas project of its kind—Operation Christmas Child—an effort that has hand-delivered 86 million gifts to kids worldwide since 1993.</p> <p>This year-round project of Samaritan's Purse is coming to its peak, as local businesses, churches and schools prepare to collect gift-filled shoe boxes during National Collection Week, Nov. 14-21. Puppy mills operate under deplorable conditions and exist only to make a profit. Females are bred as often as possible and are discarded after they can no longer produce. Puppy mill dogs are typically found at pet stores and on the internet. You can help by adopting from a shelter or rescue group. More than 20% of shelter dogs are purebred. As many as 4 million dogs are bred in puppy mills each year while at the same time about 4 million animals are killed in shelters.
