Medicare Minute	See attached	60 sec	Hi, I'm Greg Dill. And this is Medicare Minute. If you have Medicare, be careful. Thieves may try to steal your identity by stealing your Medicare number. Treat your Medicare card the way you treat your credit cards. Don't share your Medicare number or other personal information with anyone who contacts you by phone, email, or in person -- unless you've given them advance permission. Medicare is in the process of removing Social Security numbers from Medicare cards and replacing them with a new, unique number for each person with Medicare. Medicare will mail new cards with the new numbers starting in April. Scammers may tell you they need to verify your Medicare or Social Security number so you can get a new Medicare card. Don't fall for this! If someone calls and asks for your Medicare number or other personal information, hang up. And don't ever let anyone borrow or pay to use your Medicare number. Child IDs	See attached	30sec	The "Child ID" spot educates parents/guardians about the importance of getting an Arizona ID card for their children to protect their lives and their identities. Az 811	See attached	30 sec	Arizona Blue Stake is now Arizona 811 - the agency that prevents serious and fatal injuries and protects the utilities we rely on every day by ensuring underground lines are located before digging begins. Medicare Minute	See attached	60 sec	Hi, I'm Greg Dill. And this is Medicare Minute. Do you have two or more chronic illnesses, such as arthritis, cancer, diabetes, or heart disease? If you do, Medicare has a new benefit. It's called Chronic Care Management -- and it's designed to help you get more coordinated care from your doctors, pharmacist, testing centers and hospitals. If you qualify, your primary-care doctor will help you keep track of your medications and provide a comprehensive care plan. You'll get 24-hour-a-day, 7-day-a-week access for any urgent needs.

			<p>How much does Chronic Care Management cost? You'll be responsible for the usual Medicare Part B cost-sharing -- so you may have a small amount to pay. However, many people with Medicare have supplemental insurance that may cover this cost-sharing.
