Fire Safety & Prevention 4		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Hi I'm Chief Weaver from the Willcox Fire Department. If a fire breaks out in your home do you know how you will get out? Planning and practicing how you and your family would escape a fire safely could make all the difference. Plan two routes of escape from every room. Designate a meeting place outside the home. Remember get out and stay out.
Fire Safety & Prevention 5		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Do you know that children under five are twice as likely as the rest of us to die in a home fire? Children depend on their parents and other caregivers to protect them. Here's what you can do to keep children safe from home fires. Keep matches and lighters out of their reach. Maintain a working smoke alarm on every level of your home and practice a fire escape plan. Pick a meeting spot outside of the home and remember, get out and stay out.
Fire Safety & Prevention 6		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Most fires in the home, start in the kitchen. For older adults fires that begin while they are cooking are the third leading cause of fire deaths. The kitchen is a high danger zone for fire so be extra cautious when cooking. Remember not to leave cooking food unattended and don't wear loose clothing when cooking keep towels and potholders away from the range and never use the range or oven to heat your home.
Fire Safety & Prevention 7		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Did you know the third leading cause for fire deaths for older adults is cooking? Hi I'm Chief Weaver from the Willcox Fire Department with important safety tips for seniors. Never leave cooking unattended because a serious fire could start in seconds don't wear loose clothing when cooking keep towels and potholders away from the range and double check your kitchen before you go to bed or leave your home.
Fire Safety & Prevention 8		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Are space heaters in your home close to curtains a stack of newspapers or other flammable materials? Heating is the second leading cause of fire death for older adults. To make sure you'll stay warm and safe this winter follow these life saving tips. When buying a space heater look for the auto off feature should the heater fall over and keep space heaters at least three feet away from other objects.
Fire Safety & Prevention 9		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Do you know the second leading cause for fire deaths in older adults is heating? Hi I'm Chief Weaver from the Willcox Fire Department to make sure you'll stay warm and safe this winter follow these life saving tips. When buying a space heater look for the auto off feature should the heater fall over and keep space heaters at least three feet away from other objects. Your fire place should have a screen large enough to catch flying sparks and rolling logs.

Fire Safety & Prevention 10		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Do you know that children under five are twice as likely as the rest of us to die in a home fire? Hi I'm Chief Weaver from the Willcox Fire Department here's what you can do to keep children safe from home fires. Keep matches and lighters out of their reach. Maintain a working smoke alarm on every level of your home and practice a fire escape plan. Pick a meeting spot outside of your home and remember, get out and stay out.
Fire Safety & Prevention 11		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: Hi I'm Chief Weaver from the Willcox Fire Department the number one cause of preventable home fire deaths is smoking. If you smoke practice these fire safety tips to avoid putting your life, your home and your family at risk. Don't leave a burning cigarette, cigar or pipe unattended. If you feel drowsy put it out immediately. Use deep ashtrays and never smoke in bed.
Fire Safety & Prevention 12		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: This is Chief weaver of the Willcox Department of Public Safety. We should practice fire safety all year long. Many bedroom fires are caused by misuse or poor maintenance of electrical devices, careless use of candles, smoking in bed and children playing with matches and lighters. Most potential hazards can be addressed with a little common sense. For example, be sure to keep flammable items like bedding, clothes and curtains at least three feet away from portable heaters and lit candles.
Fire Safety & Prevention 13		January, February & March		30 seconds	Station produced spot read by Willcox Police Chief Jake Weaver: This is Chief weaver of the Willcox Department of Public Safety. We should practice fire safety all year long. Items like appliances or electric blankets should not be operated if they have frayed power cords and electrical outlets should never be overloaded. Install and maintain a working smoke alarm outside of every sleep area and remember to change the battery at least once a year. Designate two escape routes from each bedroom and practice them regularly.
