Tuesday: The issue on this broadcast was coverage of the 2023 Workforce Forum sponsored by the Connecticut Business & Industry Association. Chris DiPentima the president of CBIA explained where he feels the labor market is this year and the type of training that equips those entering the workforce needs to succeed.
