Monday: The issue on this broadcast was how to create a mold-free home. Laura Champagne operates her own mold removal in Connecticut and had tips on how to keep mold out of your home and remediate if your home got wet and suffered a mold outbreak. The host was Paul Kretschmer.

Tuesday: The issue on this broadcast was an introduction to an upcoming program at Union Church in Vernon Rockville, CT. Michael Ferris produces a "Journey to the Potter's House." Ferris uses the illustration of the potters wheel to demonstrate how God molds and shapes the believer to conform to God. Anissa Porticelli was the host.

Wednesday: The issue on this broadcast was on how medical doctors need to take care of themselves and maintain their health in order to properly serve their patients. Sean Rebotham MD gave examples of what his colleagues should be aware of. The host was Gerry Williams.

Thursday: The issue on this broadcast was about "Housing the Homeless." Sarah Fox is one of the leaders of a coalition of private agencies looking to provide housing for the homeless and a request for the public to do what they can to advance that objective. The host was Paul Kretschmer.

Friday: The issue on this broadcast was what Connecticut US Senator Richard Blumenthal calls deceptive advertising of so-called "Medicare Advantage" insurance policies by private health insurance carriers. Blumenthal contended that such carriers advertise special or extra benefits that are in fact standard Medicare coverage. The host was Paul Kretschmer.

Saturday: The issue on this broadcast was "Spyware on Your Phone." From Boston, Sheng Li from a research & security firm illustrated how the Commonwealth of Massachusetts has created spyware to track services residents use that utilizes an app which, even when deleted on a smartphone screen continues to operate, and even reloads repeatedly when deleted. Paul Kretschmer was the host.
