been confirmed in Taney County. Two teenagers came down with symptoms and their parents took them to the doctor. The confirmation was made Monday, but by the time that confirmation of the H1-N1 virus was made in the Taney County teens -- they had already recovered. Health Department Epidemiologist Robert Niezoda says Commission was sentenced last week following an Alford plea to charges of stealing funds from the Taney County Animal Control facility.
