Up to 4-thousand gallons of untreated sewage spilled into Lake Taneycomo Wednesday afternoon when a contractor reportedly broke a sewer line in Taney County. The Missouri Department of Natural Resources has sent an investigator to the site, where the Ozark Beach Sewer Project is under construction along Y Highway near Forsyth. According to the DNR, the incident was reported just after 3 o'clock Wednesday afternoon. The broken line carries sewage to the Edgewater Beach Resort Wastewater Treatment Facility. The pumps were shut off to stop additional sewage from reaching the lake.

Airport officials had expressed the hope last September that Branson Air Express would offer flights to more cities, when they debuted with service between Branson and Shreveport, Louisiana. Shreveport is among the cities now listed on the airport's website, with service also available on Branson Air Express to Austin and Houston, Texas; Des Moines, Iowa and Terre Haute, Indiana. The service will be offered from mid-May through mid-August, during the busy summer tourism season.

One of the original Baldknobbers, Lyle Mabe died Saturday at the age of 71. Lyle began performing with his brothers in Branson in 1959, bringing his beloved George Aggernite character to the stage, and to a long running commercial campaign for Empire Gas. Meanwhile, the Osmond family is gathering around their sister, Marie, following the announcement of her son's death in Los Angeles Friday night. Michael Blossil was 18, and apparently took his own life. Everyone at The Vacation Channel extends heartfelt condolences to the Mabe and the Osmond families

A man charged in connection with an alleged abduction and rape last fall faces a jury trial in June in Boone County. Twenty-eight year old Dale Lee Stanford was arrested November 7th of last year at the State Line RV Park near Omaha. The previous day, a woman was found by an Arkansas state trooper, walking along Highway 65. The woman reported she had been forced to drive to a remote area in Boone County by a man who had hidden in her vehicle while she made a gas purchase at Wild Bill's at the state line. The woman said the man assaulted her, then drove off in her vehicle, leaving her on the side of the road. Stanford is charged with rape, aggravated robbery, kidnapping, terroristic threatening and theft of property. Trial is scheduled for June 14th. Stanford also faces charges in Taney County of kidnapping and armed criminal action.

After Sunday's passage of the universal health care bill without a single Republican 'yes' vote, Missouri lawmakers are voicing their continued opposition. A statement from Seventh District Congressman Roy Blunt says he'll work to repeal the health care reform bill and replace it with sensible solutions. Blunt says the bill cuts Medicare, raises taxes and is too costly. A statement from Senator Kit Bond says House Democrats "have arrogantly defied the wishes of the American people." State Senator Jack Goodman issued a statement saying that if he is elected to serve the 7th Congressional District, he will fight to repeal of what he calls a "disastrous piece of legislation."
