In addition to a sewer usage fee of \$2,775 required for all new construction, the sewer tap fee is increased from \$600 to \$750, and the administrative fee is increased from \$300 to \$375. Performance bonds of one percent of the total cost of construction will also be required of any permitted development to offset the cost of repairing streets and culverts damaged by construction vehicles. Kimberling Aldermen also approved an ordinance to limit building height to two stories above grade</p>

Cox says they will continue to serve the Stone and Taney County area with their air ambulance based in Springfield.</p>
