Governor Matt Blunt wants Attorney General Jay Nixon's office to pay 540-thousand dollars for the time it would take his staff to gather up the e-mail information investigators are requesting. According to a St. Louis newspaper, a letter from the Governor's representative states that nearly 15-thousand hours of staff time would be required to retrieve and review the backup e-mail disks. Attorney General Jay Nixon began the investigation a year ago, following claims from a former legal counsel for the governor that he was fired for advising that deleting some e-mails may be a violation of open-records laws.
