Forsyth and Ash Grove Senior Centers are closed to the public until further notice. The entire First Presbyterian Church campus is closed to the public effective through Sunday, April 5. This applies to all groups that normally meet on property and includes the Main Buildings, the Old Stone Church, the Youth Building and adjoining outdoor space. Sunday services will be live-streamed on the Church's Facebook page. Faith Lutheran Church have chosen to utilize the internet for ministry instead of holding activities in the church building. They say their ministry will continue online through email, texts, Facebook.

Coronavirus cases in Missouri have been rising at an alarming rate. As of Wednesday, Missouri has confirmed over fifteen-hundred cases, a jump of 19 percent from the beginning of the week. The Missouri Department of Health says that the increase in cases is related to the increase in testing. More than seventeen-thousand people have been tested in Missouri so far, a number that exceeds any of the surrounding states. The Institute of Health Metrics and Evaluation projects that the virus will peak in Missouri in late April or early May. So please exercise caution in the next few weeks. If you are a high-risk individual, it is advised that you limit your contact with public spaces and
Details of Stay-at-Home orders in Branson and the surrounding area.	Today in Branson	April 07, 2020	Every	Approximately 3 Minutes	Individuals currently residing within the State of Missouri shall avoid leaving their homes or places of residence. When individuals need to leave their homes or places of residence to work, to access food, prescriptions, health care, and other necessities, or to engage in outdoor activity, they should at all times practice social distancing. Individuals may also go to and from an individual's place of worship, provided that limitations on social gatherings and social distancing are properly adhered to It is also recommended for high-risk individuals to wear protective face masks in public to help slow the spread of the virus. This Order does not prohibit people from accessing essential services, such as grocery stores, gas stations, and banks, or engaging in outdoor recreation, provided that necessary precautions are taken and maintained to reduce the transmission of COVID-19, including observing social gathering and social distancing requirements set forth in sections 4 and 5 of this
