**DISCUSSION:** Each guest discussed purpose, goals and mission of The League of Women Voters. They also talked about the importance of citizens applying their civic responsibility by voting. The rest of the program dealt with the pros and cons of each of the above propositions.

Proposition 91: Stopping the legislature and governor from raiding the sales on gasoline, which was to be spent on transportation projects.

Proposition 92: Would amend the state Constitution to establish independent public community college districts and boards of governors, and guarantee minimum funding for the system.

Proposition 93: Measure would shorten the overall number of years someone could serve in the legislative from 12 to 12 years – to be served in either the State Assembly and or State Senate.

Propositions 94 – 97: Four Indian Tribes could be affected by the Propositions.

Opponents of the four Indian Compacts realized by the Indians and the Governor's office listed the measures on the ballot. The measure would let stand state Compacts approved by the governor and legislature. The deals permit them to triple the number of slot machines allowed in exchange for payments to the state.

#### VOTING DAY

IT'S CAUCUS DAY IN IOWA. THE FIRST VOTES FOR THE NEXT PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA WILL BE CAST TONIGHT. KTLA'S GRANT RAMPY WAS LIVE IN DES MOINES WHERE CANDIDATES ARE DOING

EVERYTHING THEY CAN TO GET THEIR SUPPORTERS TO SHOW UP. SEVERAL CANDIDATES HAVE WRAPPED UP THEIR CAMPAIGNS WITH STATEWIDE TELEVISION APPEALS. MANY VOTERS APPARENTLY HAVE YET TO MAKE UP THEIR MINDS. A QUARTER OF LIKELY VOTERS SAY THEY EITHER HAVEN'T DECIDED ON A CANDIDATE, OR THEY COULD CHANGE THEIR DECISION. ON THE REPUBLICAN SIDE, MITT ROMNEY IS FIGHTING FOR A WIN AGAINST TOP RIVAL MIKE HUCKABEE. IT APPEARS TO BE A THREE WAY RACE FOR THE DEMOCRATS AMONG CLINTON, OBAMA AND EDWARDS. FATIGUE ON THE PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN TRAIL GOES HAND AND HAND WITH ATTACK ADS AND LAST-MINUTE SCRAPPING.

THE CANDIDATES NOW WILL FIGHT AGAINST SLEEP DEPRIVATION. THE LACK OF SLEEP HAS ALREADY CONTRIBUTED TO SOME SPEECH BLUNDERS. FORMER ARKANSAS GOVERNOR MIKE HUCKABEE OFFERED HIS "APOLOGIES" LAST WEEK OVER THE KILLING OF FORMER PRIME MINISTER BENAZIR BHUTTO OF PAKISTAN. HE MENT TO SAY "SYMPATHIES." SENATOR BARACK OBAMA, BLAMED FATIGUE FOR DRASTICALLY OVERSTATING THE DEATH TOLL FROM TORNADOES IN KANSAS. SLEEP DEPRIVATION CAN ALSO HAVE SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES. RUDY GIULIANI OF NEW YORK PARTLY FAULTED A LACK OF SLEEP FOR THE SEVERE HEADACHE THAT PUT HIM IN THE HOSPITAL LAST MONTH. SUPER TUESDAY IS LESS THAT TWO WEEKS AWAY AND THE PRESIDENTIAL RACE IS GETTING TIGHT. A NEW L.A.
