1. CONSUMER / ECONOMY / INFLATION

This continuing problem includes, but is not limited to, high interest rates, high rate of poverty among minorities and women who are heads of households, hunger, the homeless, federal state and local government spending, and the need for consumer education.

2. CRIME / CIVIL JUSTICE

This area of concern includes, among other things, an increase in youth delinquency, vandalism, proliferation of drugs, domestic and child abuse, use of neighborhood watch programs, court reform and judicious sentencing, senior citizen crime rate, and need for adequate and secure prison and county facilities. There are too many crimes committed against seniors and problems with prostitution. There is gang violence and hate crimes against the homosexual community as well.

3. EDUCATION

This issue includes, more teacher/parent involvement, art of motivation, young people need training in school readiness and work habits, funding cutbacks, effective use of funding, declining quality of education, issues concerning teacher, provision of relevant education for people of color, attitudes of teachers toward minority students. Minority youth feel disenfranchised by the system and the importance of reading classes.

4. GOVERNMENT / POLITICS

Problems in this area include, but are not limited to, cynicism and the need for elected officials and the community to work together to solve problems; inadequate political representation; threats to cut funding for health; education and social services programs; lack of Mexican-Americans in elected or appointed offices; absentee ballots; costly programs and registration of voters...verification of forms. Los Angeles City & County government lack direction and funds.

5. HEALTH / RECREATION

Concerns in this area include, among other things, the high cost of health care, funding cuts for health and recreation programs, and health care needs of the elderly. Drug abuse is a problem among the youth, more federal involvement, too much drug abuse in the community, schools and military bases, and more drug education programs. Including aids education, prevention and costs. County of Los Angeles health system lacks necessary funding.

6. MINORITY RELATIONS

The continuing concerns in this area include, but are not limited to, raising bigotry and racism often manifesting in violent acts; adequate political representations of people of color; stereotypical images; preservation of cultures; needs of minority women; and issues resulting in rise of minority populations. Additional problems include; too many liquor stores in black communities; building a better family involvement; need for more role models; need to integrate various ethnic cultures into the arts. Hispanic community lacks access to legal resources due to language barriers, economic barriers and inherent institutional racism; minority youth being disenfranchised from education system and from working world. Regarding media: news, coverage, employment, on screen image. Conflict resolution concerns between racial and ethnic communities.

7. URBAN CONCERNS

Problems in this area include: too many homeless people, the need for an efficient public transportation system, congested traffic systems, need for affordable housing, zoning problems resulting from too many homeless people, the need for affordable rental units and racial discrimination is still prevalent, gang problems.

8. EMPLOYMENT / UNEMPLOYMENT

This continuing area of concern include, but is not limited to, high minority and youth unemployment; need for apprenticeship programs; affirmative action and training programs for women and minorities; government funding cutbacks for training programs; employee lack of motivation; shutting down of major industries and the issues concerned with pay equity. Young people lack good grooming, maturity and dedication to hold jobs and minority youth feel disenfranchised.

9. HUMAN RESOURCES

This area includes but is not limited to, equal pay for women and the need for more shelters, needs of youth; including latch-key children; equal rights; women's reproductive rights; emergency housing for battered women and children; needs of single family households; and family relations.

10. ENVIRONMENT / ECOLOGY / ENERGY

Problems in this area include, but are not limited to, proper disposal of industrial waste. Santa Monica bay/ocean must be cleaned. Other issues include air pollution; legislation concerning pollution and toxic waste; cost of energy and other utilities; health problems resulting from bad air quality; extinction of rare species; and the need for the creation of desert parks. The need for more educational programs based on water conservation, minority and neighborhood environmental programs, and active youth participation in environmental programs and issues.

After only two years in business, however, The Franks' venture already averages fully developed sales between \$30,000 and \$35,000 a month. The Franks' client range from local neighborhood customers to small and mid-size businesses additionally prove how investing in a place of their own community was one of the best seeds they could have ever planted.

After working for a salon for five years, she decided to venture out on her own and partner with Mark Wasson. Maria has incorporated her Bolivian-inspired culture to the Golden Scissors Family Salon through music, artwork and Spanish ambience to cater to the growing Latino population she serves.

She maintains a small staff of eight to ten full-time employees because she enjoys the intimacy between her staff and her clients. She must keep abreast of new technology and face the high costs of hardware to succeed further. Nilza wants her clients to think of her company as Paramount Studios, but boutique style. She sees her company as an influential source of creativity and plans on producing more creative shows. She enjoys interacting with people and having the ability to voice her opinions. She claims that no idea is too outrageous and that anything and everything can be done. She hopes to double her business this year and to have the studio run twenty-four hours a day.

Antoine Royster (www.dreamonesedans.com), originally from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was working with an internet company where he fared quite well until 2001 when the company folded. While traveling, a friend in the chauffeured sedan business picked him up at the airport in a limousine. Antoine discovered that transportation service and interacting with people appealed to him, so in 2000, he developed a business plan to start a full service ground transportation service, DREAM ONE LIMOUSINE. He invested \$80,000 to buy a limousine and sedan. He used word of mouth, advertising his business to local hotel bellhops, to market his business. In October 2004, he moved into an actual office, and since then, the company has grown 25-30%. He wants to start a more aggressive marketing campaign to increase business. His immediate goal is to increase his business with his current customers and to eventually expand to other cities.

Their love and thirst for success, however, did not yield to the driving forces of the business. Five years later, the business cruised to optimistic acceleration when it landed two big contracts. Shortly after, A.M Ortega Construction, Inc was born and took full flight with an estimated \$1.5 million contract. With past clients such as The Edison Company and the Minority Business Enterprise under their belt, the originally home office business has effectively transitioned into corporate America.

Climbing the corporate ladder was a desire Allen Teng always had a determination for. His climb began when he earned a degree in Chemistry and a Master's in Computer Science. By the age of 29, Teng had already become the overseer in the systems application department for a bank. Due to language barriers, however, his climb to the top tumbled downhill and prompted him to resign. In 1989, Teng decided to open his own IT Staffing Firm (Ten Tec), and consulted his former employer from the previous job. Teng further reached out to former contacts to build up his clientele. Teng's second attempt up the corporate ladder reaped \$1.1 million in profits the first year. In 2007, the Firm's profit projected \$30 million. His prestigious clients from Sony, Universal, Honda, and beyond also exemplify that climbing the corporate ladder mandates tenacity, determination, and, in some cases, several attempts.

Legalzoom.com (323-962-8600) is the nation's first online provider of comprehensive legal documentation services. The basic goal of the business is to be of assistance and convenience to those who need to take care of routine, uncontested legal matters without the time or costs of hiring an attorney. The website offers simple questionnaires and help menus that guide customers to make their own legal decisions and also create their own customized legal documents. The company also offers live one-on-one assistance for final review of documents to ensure completeness and consistency by legal document assistants. **Brian Lee** (President) and **Brian Liu** (CEO), the co-founders of Legalzoom.com met at UCLA's School of Law. The business started out of Lee's apartment, with barely any money, and no staff to assist them. The duo took a chance and phoned high-power attorney Robert Shapiro who listened, liked their idea, and together, the three formed an alliance that has proven to be successful and unique. Shapiro's influence was getting the name out to the media and the legal world, while the two Brian's were the one's who found the money, the space, and created the plan to get the business organized. Today they are based in Hollywood and employ eighty people in a 30,000 square foot office space. They also have a satellite office in Las Vegas. The numbers of last year's gross revenues were in the multi-millions of dollars and the actual growth of the business was over 400 percent.
