New research shows that 75% percent of children with milk allergy will be able tolerate it if it is heated extensively. If the finding of the research is confirmed, Dr. Flowers say the approach to diagnosing and managing children with milk allergies should change. Allowing ingestion of heated milk products will dramatically improve the quality of life for the majority of children with milk allergy by vastly increasing the variety of food products they are able to consume.
