Section I. Issues

The Stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Mental Health Awareness:** There is an increased focus on mental health in the wake of the pandemic. Stress is causing not only physical health issues in our region but it is leading to an increase in suicides, depression, and other mental health issues including addiction that can impact people in many ways. Many people suffer in silence so we focused on organizations that are working in the community to create awareness and help individuals.
- **Environmental Awareness:** Our area is well used by its resident and visiting population. This year there have been many topics that have become newsworthy due to environmental concerns. Wildlife management, weather patterns, use of local open space for tourism, and the Leave No Trace policy along with other concerns have put our local environment front and center. Drug Take-Back Day, Earth Day, bear sighting increases, and the 4 R's were all discussed this quarter.
- **Local Economy:** This quarter the local economy was still being affected by COVID and now rising costs for basic goods such as food, housing, and fuel. Unemployment remains an issue. Business closures are still happening but expansions are starting to happen as well. Many people are still experiencing personal economic hardships. This quarter we took a look at the local price increases causing additional financial stress in the region. We discussed the need for affordable housing and the \$10 million grant awarded for a new food bank facility.
- **Local and State Legislation:** Over the last quarter there were many programs and legislations introduced and adopted at both the state and local levels. We focused on some of the policies that had a direct effect on the residents. Shows included what's being done to recruit emergency personnel, we look at county fuel tax holidays, and other policies being developed at our local county levels.
- **Community Awareness:** People's lives continue to be affected by the COVID 19 pandemic however, some have returned to activities in their community, and many local organizations are looking for people to join and volunteer. Various groups discussed their purpose in the community including the need for the public to join them. Local firefighters talked about recruitment and the Hyde Park Education Foundation discussed helping in the classroom.
