### **SECTION I. Issues**

- A) **Education:** Next to health care, education is likely the biggest concern for southern Minnesota families. Not just learning, but also everything else that surrounds and supports the learning opportunities in Minnesota schools.

**Program Description:** This week's program included discussions regarding the University of Minnesota's expected announcement of its four finalists for president, and expected busy day for district court judges on Valentine's Day, a strong start to the season for the U of M Women's Gymnastics team, and a mild, dry winter in Minnesota has officials concerned about a growing wildfire danger.
