Latest on an 8-year-old shot at his home after a gunman opened fire at the kid's dad. he gunman shot at the boy's father about 10 times, Preciado said. Though initially it was not exactly clear where the boy had been when he was shot, Preciado said Monday afternoon that the gunfire went through a wall in the living room into the boy's bedroom. The boy's father ran into the bedroom to try to shield his son, and evidence at the scene indicated the gunman followed the father and continued to fire, the sergeant said. The boy had already been struck when the father went in to try to protect him further, an initial investigation showed. Another child who was sleeping in the home but was unharmed, as was the father. The gunman fled the home, and some witnesses said they saw a white vehicle leaving the scene. Investigators did not confirm if that vehicle was associated with the assailant. The boy's father had been arguing with the gunman prior to the shooting.

The Los Angeles Police Department has submitted its proposed procedures for the use and deployment of body worn video by uniformed police officers to the Board of Police Commissioners for its consideration. The proposed order requires officers to record investigative and enforcement contacts with members of the public and contains provisions to maintain the integrity of criminal and administrative investigations. In addition, the proposed order protects the privacy rights and civil liberties of the community and Department personnel while enabling officers to collect reliable evidence for use in criminal prosecutions, use of force and citizen complaint investigations, and other reviews and examinations. The proposed order is a result of extensive outreach efforts and careful consideration of a variety of ideas, opinions, and concerns expressed by a broad spectrum of stakeholders. The Department consulted with several community groups, employee organizations, union representatives, privacy advocates, department personnel, legal experts, academics, prosecutors and law enforcement agencies in developing the proposed procedures. In addition, the procedures are informed by the LAPD's experience in using Digital In-Car Video in South Los Angeles for the past five years. The Board of Police Commissioners will consider the Department's proposal at its regularly scheduled meeting today.

A woman was struck and injured a week ago in a fast-food restaurant parking lot in Huntington Beach, and police have released surveillance footage in hopes of finding the driver who sped away. Huntington Beach police responded to an injury crash shortly before 2:40 p.m. April 22 at McDonald's, 16866 Beach Blvd. An 85-year-old woman was crossing the parking lot with two people when a man driving a newer-model, gray Dodge Challenger reversed his car and hit her, according to surveillance camera footage. A passenger in the car, a white or Asian woman in her early 20s with long, dark hair who was about 5-foot-5, got out and went over to the woman who had been struck. The driver, a white or Asian man in his mid-20s with short, dark hair and about 6 feet tall, also got out, but only briefly, before he and the female passenger returned to the car and drove away. The woman who was struck injured her head during the crash.

In a press conference, Attorney General Kamala D. Formed by President Napolitano in June 2014, the task force has developed and helped implement systemwide recommendations to prevent and respond to sexual assault and sexual violence on UC campuses. In January, Harris issued an information bulletin to California law enforcement agencies, higher education administrators and campus security personnel, providing enforcement guidance on new and amended sexual assault and campus safety laws and encouraging increased collaboration between law enforcement and campus authorities.

A high-profile former second-in-command at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department — who last year ran unsuccessfully for sheriff — has been indicted for allegedly overseeing a scheme to disrupt an FBI investigation into the abuse of inmates at county jails. Former Undersheriff Paul Tanaka, who is the mayor of the city of Gardena, was indicted Wednesday on federal charges after a month's long grand jury proceeding. Alongside Tanaka, former sheriff's Capt. William "Tom" Carey was also charged. The two men surrendered to the FBI at the federal building near Westwood Thursday morning, when the 25-page indictment was unsealed and distributed by the U.S. Department of Justice.

Nepalese rescuers on Friday found three bodies near the wreckage of a U.S. Marine helicopter that disappeared this week during a relief mission in the earthquake-hit Himalayan nation, and officials said it was unlikely there were any survivors from the crash. Eric Seaman, a Marine from Murrieta, has been reported to be among the crew on the missing helicopter. People at the address listed for Seaman declined to comment Wednesday to The Press-Enterprise. Relatives of Seaman who are posting on Facebook about the helicopter also have declined to comment to the media. At the Seaman residence in Murrieta, the mood was somber as members of his family and his friends waited for more details about the discovery of the helicopter. In front of the door, a handwritten note posted by the family asked for members of the news media to respect the family's privacy. On social media outlets, friends, neighbors and family members offered up prayers of support and expressed hope for Seaman's safe return. The helicopter was carrying six Marines and two Nepalese army soldiers. A separate team sent by the U.S. Marines said they identified the wreckage as the missing helicopter, the UH-1 "Huey."

Federal, state and local officials were responding to a 4-mile-wide oil slick that poured from a ruptured pipeline into the waters off Refugio State Beach in Santa Barbara County on Tuesday. A pungent smell wafted across the coastline from the spilled oil on the popular beach about 20 miles west of downtown Santa Barbara. U.S. Coast Guard crews were responding to an “unknown sheen” at Refugio, the guard’s Los Angeles/Long Beach office Twitter account initially stated. The sheen was from a ruptured pipeline on the shore side that had been “secured,” the Coast Guard office later confirmed in a tweet. Houston-based Plains All-American Pipeline was later as the “responsible party.” The company did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Aerial video from Sky5 showed a large amount of dark oil in the water and on the sand, workers were treating a spill in a field on the other side of the 101 Freeway from the beach. About 21,000 gallons had flowed into the ocean, the Los Angeles Times reported, citing Coast Guard officials.

The Los Angeles City Council tentatively agreed Tuesday to raise the city's minimum wage to \$15 per hour, joining a trend sweeping cities across the country as elected leaders seek to address stagnating pay for workers on the lowest rungs of the socio-economic ladder. The ordinance would boost the \$9 an hour base wage to \$15 by 2020 for as many as 800,000 workers, city officials say, and make L.A. the largest U.S. city to adopt a major minimum-wage increase. Chicago, San Francisco and Seattle already have adopted similar laws. Tuesday's 14-1 vote was the latest demonstration of organized labor's clout at City Hall. Through close to a year of often-emotional debate, labor leaders never gave ground on their central demand that the minimum wage rise to at least \$15. Their City Council allies ensured that a less far-reaching wage increase proposed by Mayor Eric Garcetti to allay concerns in the business community was marginalized in the final months of discussion.

Homicide detectives are seeking the public's assistance in obtaining any information related to the murder of 19 year-old Vicente Castillo. On December 23, 2014, Mr. Castillo was shot to death while driving his vehicle near the intersection of White Avenue and Rose Street, Compton. At the time of the incident, Mr. Castillo stopped adjacent to a vehicle he inadvertently believed was being driven by a friend. The driver of the vehicle exited, approached Mr. Castillo as he sat behind the wheel of his vehicle, and shot him for no apparent reason. Mr. Castillo suffered a gunshot wound to the upper body and was transported to Saint Francis Medical Center where he succumbed to his injuries, hours after the assault. The City of Compton as well as the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors has collectively offered a reward of \$20,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the suspect. Mr. Santos was a full time student at Cal State University Long Beach, and was set to begin playing with the Barcelona, Spain developmental soccer team, which is associated to the Galaxy professional soccer team. He is survived by his mother, Maria Ponce, his sister and brothers. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is seeking any information to assist in identifying the suspect responsible for the senseless murder of Mr. Castillo.
