ORIGINAL LOCALLY PRODUCED PROGRAMS OF RESPONSE

“FORUM” is produced in-studio by Public Affairs Director Jon Michaels for thirty minutes and airs every Sunday morning. Jon Michaels has been doing this program since the FCC first required it in 1977. Jon has received the “GOLDEN APPLE” award from the South Dakota Education Association, the “BRIGHT IDEA” award from the Sioux Falls Public Relations Network for “lifetime achievement”, the “GOLDEN WINGS MEDAL” from the Children’s Care Hospital and “VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR” from Downtown Sioux Falls (formerly Main Street). Jon has also received awards from the Associated Press over the years of what is still the longest running public affairs show host in Sioux Falls radio History.

COMMUNITY ISSUES AND ASSERTAINMENT

MENTAL HEALTH AND HOMELESS: Much needs to be learned and communicated as to just what mental health is and how to deal with it on a city level.

GOVERNMENT: Government agencies that help prepare for severe weather to how our local government helps those (“Lost Boys”) that have experienced the tragedy of their government in Sudan.

CULTURE: Music that is original to our community from rock bands to one of the oldest municipal bands in the country.

RELIGION: A sign of a good community is that we still have more churches than police in Sioux Falls.

RECREATION: From sprint cars that win a quarter million dollars for first place to a baseball park that is a partner of Major League Baseball.

MAJOR EVENTS THAT AFFECT SIOUX FALLS: Huge car shows, Memorial Day participants that affect our schedules to national cartoon conventions. (Even a local cartoonist that is published nationally)

History Since 1826

The City Mission Movement goes back to the year 1826, when David Nasmith, a former manufacturer's apprentice, founded the Glasgow, (Scotland) City Mission for the purpose of practical ministry for the underprivileged, proclaiming the Gospel in everyday language. David Nasmith is the spiritual father of the City Mission Movement and founded a number of ministries including the Dublin Christian Mission, London City Mission, as well as 31 other Missions in the United States and Canada.

The first USA, Gospel Rescue Mission opened on Water Street in 1872 in New York City when former alcoholic and ex-con Jeremiah McAuley founded his "Helping Hand for Man" on the

site of a licentious dance hall. It was backed by stock trader Alfrederich Smith Hatch, who believed in uplifting those unfit for charity, whom he called the “undeserving or unworthy poor.”

Thomas F. Morse was convicted in Roberts County, SD for the shooting death of a Sisseton man in September of 1893. Morse made a decision in prison to give his heart and life to Jesus Christ, through the ministry of Mother Wheaton, a woman who visited the prison and proclaimed the Gospel. He was granted a full pardon by Governor Andrew Lee in 1898. On March 17, 1900 he became the founder of the Sioux Falls City Rescue Mission.

Spreading The Hope of Jesus Christ

Today, Union Gospel Mission is the largest emergency shelter in the Sioux Falls area, providing shelter and meals for an average of 125 men, women, and children each night, along with a resident addiction recovery program, and an average of 900 food boxes to the community poor each week.

The Sioux Falls Municipal Band, one of the oldest and most prestigious bands in the nation, has been performing without interruption since 1919. The band's performances begin with the Armed Forces Day Celebration in May each season and continue through early August. Special events include the Flag Day performance at Veterans' Memorial Park, the Independence Day Celebration, and the Jaycees' annual 4th of July Celebration.

17,000 people annually attend the Municipal Band concerts which include performances each Sunday, and additional performances during the week.

Band members are selected and compensated for their services.

Renovations in the late 1990's included new luxury box suites, an expanded picnic area and a new grass berm down the third

base line. The ballpark exterior features two ticket entrances and a beautiful brick wall around the outside.

The ballpark has a capacity to seat 4,462 fans, with a walkway splitting two levels of seating, allowing fans to catch every second of the action.
