### July 5, 2020

What does it mean to be an American? Magistrate Judge Nancy Joseph, a Haitian immigrant, now a naturalized citizen says, it means remaining hopeful about all the possibilities of what America can be. We follow her as she presides over a naturalization ceremony in Milwaukee.

Then, as cases of COVID-19 surge, pressure mounts to find a vaccine. Deliberately infecting volunteers with the virus could accelerate the search. Is it worth it? Special Contributor Joie takes us inside a controversial shortcut known as "Human Challenge Trials."

Plus, knocked down but not out. How a boxing gym in Detroit became an unlikely source of support for a community facing hard knocks during the pandemic.

And revisit our conversation with Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor about the state of civics in the country. She tells Soledad we're forgetting what we all have in common by only focusing on why we're different.

Finally, an ancient evergreen, 19 hundred years old has just been discovered in China. That's old, but still about seven thousand years too young to hold a record on age.

### July 12, 2020

An uncontrollable surge in coronavirus cases leads to dire warnings from health experts. The country's faced this before during another pandemic, the flu of 1918. What can our past teach us about the present pandemic?

Plus, calculating the cost of economic recovery. Economist Heidi Shierholz tells Soledad, if congress lets a boost in unemployment benefits expire, everyone could feel the impact, even if you're still working.

Then, a crisis within a crisis, we go to Lincoln, Nebraska, inside a community of refugees struggling to stay afloat during the pandemic while still trying to feed their families back home.

And a new ruling from the United States Supreme Court decides how the president gets elected.

Finally, Soledad reflects on America's moment of reckoning on race and her recently published op-ed in the New York Times, titled "A Me Too Moment for Journalists of Color."

### July 19, 2020

What are the considerations? How would social distancing work? What kinds of schedules would allow classes to move forward and parents to go back to work? Soledad is joined by Merrie Najimy, President of the 110,000 member Massachusetts Teachers Association, for a discussion of the pros and cons of re-opening schools, and the guidelines her members say should serve as the framework for decision making.

And, "A Most Beautiful Thing" is ready for a premiere. The documentary, about Chicago's first all-black rowing team, examines the issues of trauma and racism in a powerful story about how kids from rival neighborhoods on Chicago's west side come together on the water, as an unlikely rowing team. Soledad talks with filmmaker, Mary Mazzio, Arshay Cooper, the film's inspiration, and former NBA star, Grant Hill, who serves as an Executive Producer on the project. Get a sneak peek at the film, and share a conversation about how trauma and racism impacted the lives of the crew members and shaped their adult experiences. We talk about their on-camera reunion 20 years after high school, and why they decided to row again, this time with members of the Chicago Police Department.

Plus, we take you back to the Detroit boxing gym that traded punches for lunches to help the families in need because of COVID-19.

### **July 26, 2020**

We follow a COVID-19 contact tracer, rushing to stop the spread of the disease and fighting to combat the stigma surrounding a positive test result. Then we talk to an infectious disease doctor, Amesh Adalja who tells Soledad even without a COVID-19 vaccine in sight, there's still a reason to be hopeful about some of treatments we already have.

Then the United States Postal Service says it could run out of money by the end of the year. So just how did one of America's oldest and largest employers get in a cash crunch? Correspondent Joie Chen takes us to Bethel, Alaska and the shores of Eastern, Maryland to show us what a future without the post office would look like for people who rely on it.

Plus, Joe Biden promised to pick a woman as his running mate and Kelly Dittmar, a professor of political science at Rutgers-Camden says his pick could redefine the race to the White House.

And what's the proper way to honor a man who risked his life to ensure everyone had the right to vote? Democrats want to reinstate parts of the Voting Rights Act and rename it after the late Congressman John Lewis (D-GA). But Republicans are opposed to both ideas. So how will his peers remember the man often called, "The Conscience of the Congress?"

Finally, the non-profit, Pizza to the Polls wants to deliver more than hot slices come November. It started as a campaign to feed hungry voters, now the organization wants to recruit 250,000 young poll workers.

### **August 2, 2020**

Correspondent Jessica Gomez takes us inside a rural hospital on life support. Like many other rural hospitals, Titus Regional Medical Center in Texas, was operating on razor-thin margins, now it's pushed to the brink with a surge of COVID-19 cases, insured patients, all while it has cancelled the elective surgeries that generate most of its money.

Then, with more than half of adults reporting higher levels of stress and anxiety, Dr. Vaile Wright, of the American Psychological Association tells Soledad the next curve we need to flatten will be for a mental health crisis.

Whether it's fear over foreign interference, voter suppression, fights over mail-in voting, democracy faces a big test, in less than 100 days. Matthew Weil is the director of the Elections Project of the Bipartisan Policy Center, and he tells Soledad calling this election will much different.

And, President Trump officially rolls back an Obama-era housing rule meant to combat segregation in the suburbs.

Finally, a reminder that innovation to fight COVID-19 is happening daily. We look at new facial mask that could literally save lives and a possible gamechanger in detecting the virus- an at-home test kit.

### **August 9, 2020**

Who gets the COVID-19 vaccine first? Will there be enough to go around? Should you have to pay for it? We're tracking the timeline for a vaccine with Dr. James Hildreth, immunologist and president and CEO of Meharry Medical College. He tells Soledad we should adjust our expectations if we're hoping to see a vaccine by the end of the year.

Plus, nearly three years after Hurricane Maria left a tropical paradise powerless, Puerto Ricans who fled the island now have the power to determine the next president. Will they flip the biggest battleground state from red to blue? Special Contributor Joie Chen reports from central Florida.

Then, a once silent epidemic grows louder, after a new report documents more than 2,300 cases of missing and murdered Native American women and girls. While so many have vanished, families tell us they wonder why so little is being done about it.

And it's a battle of the ages. Boomers are now outnumbered, with people over the age 40 now the majority. How will the next generation leave its mark on the country?

And finally, nothing says celebration quite like champagne. But COVID-19 has cancelled celebratory occasions worldwide. With sales flat, the champagne bubble is set to burst. Producers will decide to between destroying grapes instead of lowering the price of a bottle of bubbly, or selling them off to make alcohol, for hand sanitizer.

### **August 16, 2020**

This month marks 100 years since women won the right to vote in America. Since then we've had three women as vice presidential candidates for major parties, and one woman at the top of the ticket. But what else has changed and what has not, since the 19th Amendment was ratified? Historians -Ann Gordon, Marcia Chatelain, and Maggie Blackhawk-join Soledad for a discussion about how women shape democracy now and how they changed it even before they could vote.

From the past to the future, how are young women inspired to vote today? Two students, Naba Rahman, a Republican, and Allison Tovar, a Democrat, talk about how the 19th Amendment shapes their political engagement today and what role gender plays in the upcoming 2020 election.

Plus, we go inside the "Rightfully Hers" exhibit at the National Archives for a look back at the 19th Amendment. With millions of documents available, how do you choose which ones make the cut? Soledad gets a special look at some of the most interesting items with curator, Corinne Porter. They include the patent for a special "gendered" voting booth and details on which women got to vote before the 19th Amendment.

Plus, how a "Night of Terror" at a prison just outside of Washington, D.C. changed history. We go inside the transformation of a former prison of suffragists turned Arts Center.

And is it suffragist and suffragette? Depends on where you live. Why did the United States reject the term suffragette while other countries embraced it?

### **August 23, 2020**

Will your vote count? Trevor Potter runs the Campaign Election Center and was general counsel to John McCain's 2000 and 2008 presidential campaign, he tells Soledad what states need today to protect mail-in ballots in November.

While congress fights over the next stimulus package, more people are turning to food banks. But how long can they feed this need? Since losing his job, Brett Pavia walks one mile to pick up free groceries from a food bank in Milwaukee. He felt so guilty about needing help, he's now a volunteer at the food bank. Then we talk to Trinity Tran of Urban Partners Los Angeles, who runs one of the largest food banks in the country. She tells Soledad, people are now waiting in lines for seven hours, to get food.

Plus, NASCAR is not known for its diversity and it drove straight into controversy over the decision to ban the Confederate flag at races, raising the question, can the sport keep up with social change?

We meet the young driver, Blake Lothian, who's hoping to steer a new generation of fans and drivers to the sport.

And, Democrats accused Republicans of trying to "steal the election," with the use of mail-in ballots. Sound familiar? This battle over ballots is as old as the Civil War? So, what did President Lincoln think about absentee ballots in 1864?

Finally, across the country schools are closing just as fast as they're opening. So, what do kids caught in the middle of the debate feel? Two teens from New York City school us on what they think is best.

This week on Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien – The national political party conventions are over, and the campaigns are focusing on turning out the vote in November. And, felony convictions in Tennessee result in the revocation of a person's right to vote. We look inside the debate over First Amendment rights to peaceful assembly with Representative Jason Hodges, a U.S. Marine, first term democratic legislator in the Tennessee General Assembly, who says the measure goes too far.

And, we look at the global impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Mass unemployment, lost wages, and an economic downturn have immigrant and refugee families in the U.S. struggling to send money and goods to families living in nations with rising food insecurity. As a group refugees send about 500 billion dollars to their families, a lifeline being cut off. Our correspondent Jessica Gomez takes us to Lincoln, Nebraska, with one of the nation's largest populations of resettled refugees, for a look at the efforts to feed families on the other side of the globe.

Then, the November election is just over two months away, and election officials across the country are bracing for an avalanche of absentee and mail-in ballots. We look to Wisconsin, a battleground state, where more than 20 thousand mail in ballots were rejected in the April primary, and where officials say they expect nearly two million requests for mail-in ballots for November. It's a pressure packed situation as we found out when we spent a day with the head of the state's Municipal Clerks Association for a personal look at the challenge of meeting the demand.

Finally, Tulsa wants you! Yes, you heard us. Tulsa, Oklahoma wants you to relocate if you can, and the city is offering a \$10,000 incentive to make you stop and think about it. Tulsa Remote is recruiting remote workers and digital nomads, and they think COVID 19 might make workers consider their offer. We'll tell you what they're offering, and just how many folks have taken them up, and made the move.

## **September 6, 2020**

Soledad has a conversation with attorney and former politician Bakari Sellers about his new memoir, "My Vanishing Country." At 22, he became the youngest, Black elected official in the country, when he joined the South Carolina State Legislature. At 35, he reflects on the forces that shaped him. His story begins February 8, 1968, 16 years before he was born. That night, highway patrolmen shot his father, Cleveland Sellers, a civil rights activist, during a protest to integrate a bowling alley. He tells Soledad that was the most important day his life.

And, her young son does not have a criminal record, yet police have stopped him more than 100 times. She opens about the fear of raising a Black son in America and how mothers have become invisible victims of police violence.

Then, in the aftermath of ongoing police shootings of black people, sociologist, Dr. Rashawn Ray tells Soledad the protests demanding justice have grown bigger, more diverse, and could mark a turning point in the larger movement in the fight against systemic racism.

Plus, as COVID-19 races through the rural town of Immokalee, FL, can healthcare workers gain the trust of the town's residents: migrant workers, many who are undocumented? Doctors Without Borders- an international aid organization- tries to stop the virus in its tracks before the workers head to other states for work.

Who's policing the police? A national discussion over police accountability grows with a focus on a legal rule called "qualified immunity," which can shield public officials even when they break the law.

And finally, the power of pictures. Some chaotic, some peaceful, some haunting, a look at portraits of protest from around the world.

Soledad O'Brien examines the issues with Stephen Saltzburg, a law professor and career public servant who worked for Attorney General Bill Barr, and says government lawyers have no business getting involved in the President's personal legal battles.

Plus, why did George Washington want the nation's capital to be on the Potomac? New York and Philadelphia were contenders in the race to be the seat of the federal government. Washington made a backroom deal with three founding fathers to create the District of Columbia. What was the real reason for the deal? It's not a pretty story. It's the story of slavery, and the men and women who cast the monuments to a freedom they did not share.

Then, what it means to be an American. Meet Judge Nancy Joseph—who gives the oath of citizenship to new generations of Americans. It's her American story that inspires them. Judge Joseph, a child of Haiti, came to the United States at age 8, and followed her dream to become a citizen. Find out why she says the moment when immigrants take the oath is the beginning of the next great American story.

And, where will we get 350,000 poll workers before the November election? Corporate America steps up to fill the void created by COVID 19.

With older poll workers calling it quits, the need is great. Now, Target, Starbucks, and Old Navy are giving workers a paid day off to help out on election day. We'll fill you in on the companies and the innovations working to make sure you can safely cast your vote in November.

Finally, stop and smell the "sunflowers." You thought it was roses, didn't you? Wrong! A Wisconsin farmer thinks you need a little more sunshine in your life. And who doesn't? To combat the fatigue of coping with COVID-19, Scott Thompson decided to plant 22 acres of sunflowers. That's 2 million blooms on 15 fields. Now, his farm is a destination for taking selfies, and picking bouquets—all while maintaining social distance. There's a charge. But, the sunshine is free. We'll take you there for a pick me up.

## **September 20, 2020**

When it comes to political news, how do you know what you see or hear is accurate? We're separating fact from fiction with Angie Holan of Politifact. But once voters have the facts, what happens when they filter information through a partisan lens, dismissing facts they disagree with? Soledad interviews Whitney Phillips, Syracuse University assistant professor who teaches media ethics, mis- and disinformation political communication, about how the rise of hoaxes and conspiracy theories are shaping democracy.

Then, unimaginable wildfires create unimaginable loss. And recovery from the current deadly wildfires on the West Coast will take years. It's a story all too familiar to the people who returned to Paradise, CA after a fire destroyed the town. We document families trying to piece their lives back together after one of the deadliest fires in the state history.

Plus, going for the gold. Why Chellsie Memmel, a retired mother of two, is determined to mount a comeback. We follow her quest for a spot on the women's USA gymnastics team. A spot she held a decade ago.

And if a COVID-19 vaccine was ready soon, would you take it? A large portion of Americans say, "no." Will that stop the country from stopping the virus in its tracks?

Finally, do we have company in the cosmos? Scientists want to search for life on Venus, a planet with temperatures pushing 900 degrees. The idea of life in our solar system's hottest planet may have sounded absurd, until scientists detected a gas made only by life, human or microbe.
