The Presidential Medal of Honor is the highest award given to a military hero in America. But what happens when a hero is overlooked? Soledad O'Brien reports on the paths of two service members, both veterans of the Vietnam War, both recognized for their heroism. Col. Harvey Barnum's career soared after receiving his medal just months after his nomination. But Staff Sgt. Melvin Morris waited decades for an honor delayed. It's a story of how bias prevented one man's recognition, and how the nation went about righting a wrong.

Plus, a marine who lost both legs to an IED explosion while serving in Afghanistan keeps on running. Correspondent Diane Roberts has the story of Rob Jones' mission to raise awareness for other wounded warriors. It's a story of endurance and hope.

Then, a little history about the only woman to receive the Medal of Honor. We've got the story of Mary Edwards Walker, a veteran of the Civil War, who risked her life to save others. Find out what she did that earned her the medal.

And, you might be surprised to hear that 2.5 million American women have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. In fact, their service dates back to the Revolutionary War. There's only one national monument honoring the women who've defended the nation. So, we give you a look at the Women in Military Service for America Memorial, and a guide to what you'll find there.

July 11, 2021

This week on Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien we explore what it means to be an American. Our nation is irreversibly diverse. But does that mean we're also irreversibly divided? Special correspondent Jessica Gomez sets off on a road trip across the middle of country, on I-70 from Denver to St. Louis, to find out what people have to say about their American identity and what holds the nation together.

Then, who built America? To help answer that question, special correspondent Ray Suarez explores the building of the Transcontinental Railroad. The arduous work of connecting east and west took decades and brought 16,000 Chinese immigrants into our nation as essential workers. But once the railroad was completed, the Chinese immigrants found themselves in a legal limbo. The Chinese Exclusion Act prevented them from ever becoming citizens. Passed in 1882, it was law until the end of World War II. Hear the story through the lens of a man whose great grandfather helped build the railroad, which, in fact, helped build America.

Plus, Soledad talks with Pulitzer prize-winning journalist and found of the New York Times 1619 Project, Nikole Hannah Jones. It's a discussion about the lessons her father taught her about service to country and belonging. African Americans serve in the U.S. Armed Forces at levels higher than any other racial group. Yet, often they are not recognized as full citizens. The conversation provides a look at how we judge allegiance and belonging.

And, he was brought to America as a child. He was just months too old to be given DACA status. After 40 years in the country, he is still undocumented. In his own words, Jose Antonio Vargas, a Pulitzer prize-winning journalist, Emmy nominated filmmaker, and author, expresses his views on what it means to be an American, and what it's like to live your entire adult life as an "undocumented citizen."

In the J-Unit, non-violent offenders get to bond with their newborns while serving time. The Superintendent of Washington Corrections Center for Women tells Soledad, this program is for the sake of the baby, not just the mom. But critics ask, "do babies belong behind bars?" In this week's program, we follow a mom raising her daughter in the J-Unit, a mother on the waiting list, and one who learns she'll lose her baby immediately after giving birth. And, we look at what happens to the children left behind when their parents are serving time.

August 1, 2021

This week on Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien, unimaginable wildfires create unimaginable loss. And recovery from the current deadly wildfires on the West Coast will take years. It's a story all too familiar to the people who returned to Paradise, California in 2018 after a wildfire destroyed the town. We document families trying to piece their lives back together after one of the deadliest fires in state history.

Then, American workers burned out and trying to balance work and home life. As more businesses rebound, employees are adjusting to new routines, some still at home, some back in the office, and some with varying schedules. But has the year of living and working through a pandemic changed what employees want from their jobs? Soledad talks with Beth Humberd, an Associate Professor of Management at the University of Massachusetts-Lowell, about what companies can do to attract and retain employees seeking a better work-life balance.

Plus, how can we lift families out of poverty? Starting July 15th, roughly 39 million families started receiving a monthly Child Tax Credit check. These are funds that families usually claim on their taxes at year end. Policy makers on both sides of the aisle are looking to see if the experiment could work to move families out of poverty. We go to New Mexico, where the child poverty rate is one in four, compared to one in seven, nationally. One mother tells us how she'll use the money to support her three children, and why it could be the game changer they've been waiting for. Then, Soledad talks with New Mexico State Representative Javier Martinez about the policy change, the evidence he hopes will emerge from the experiment, and where the policy could lead America's families.

And we explore a seismic shift in American households. Two generations ago, forming your own family and buying your own home marked the passage to adulthood. Now, millennials, wounded by the pandemic and the economic downturn, are living the experiences most similar to their Depression-era counterparts. A Pew Research Center study finds a majority of young adults, ages 18-29, now live with parents and grandparents—more than during the Great Depression. We hear the very personal story of Andie Karanas, a recent college graduate and writer, who moved back to her parents' home in New Jersey, joining two siblings, and her grandparents. We get a look at what life is like when three adult generations share a home.

Finally, preparations are underway for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games. The host city is looking for ways to get guests between venues that are miles apart. The solution they're testing is a mini flying taxicab. It seats two people and luggage, and flies at about 18 miles an hour. Recent tests of the Volocopter are a reason for optimism. But how would you hail this flying taxi? Well, of course, there's an app for that. We'll show you the flying taxi in action.

August 8, 2021

This week on MATTER OF FACT with Soledad O'Brien, a reminder that the unexpected changes lives. We share the story of an unlikely friendship that started with a call to police. Dana Marsh, a young police officer, responds to the scene of a drug deal, and arrests suspect, Gerrel Jones. That first meeting creates an unlikely bond that will withstand a murder trial, prison time, and nearly three decades. Correspondent Jessica Gomez takes us to Birmingham, Alabama for a look at how their remarkable connection has transformed so many lives.

Then, the push to get Americans vaccinated. As COVID cases and hospitalizations rise amid the spread of the highly contagious Delta variant, the nation grapples with a stalled vaccination effort. Vaccine hesitancy appears to be giving way to vaccine refusal. Even as states and cities look to re-open schools, vaccination rates are lagging for teenagers who are eligible for the shots. Soledad talks with Brian Castrucci, the President and CEO of the de Beaumont Foundation, and a leading voice on public health issues, about overcoming vaccine hesitancy—especially when it comes to our kids.

Plus, the investigation into the January 6th riot at the U.S. Capitol reveals some startling news about warnings that were ignored by officials in executive and legislative roles. Given the information available on social media about the organizers and the plans for the event itself, why was it a surprise to police and policy makers? Soledad talks with a former analyst with the Department of Homeland Security about an internal report he authored more than a decade ago that detailed how far-right extremists planned to recruit and radicalize returning military veterans to carry out violence. Johnson tells Soledad the report was ridiculed and then written off by powerful politicians. He says politicizing the 2009 report hobbled any serious public discussion about how to deal with the emerging threat of terrorism at home.

And is the American Dream within reach for a generation of potential home buyers from families without generational wealth? They are caught in the tightest housing market in decades and face skyrocketing prices. We follow two young people looking to buy in and hear how they view the challenges and the opportunities for acquiring their piece of the American Dream.

Finally, do you love trivia? Then remember this name: Kathy Sullivan. We'll take a deep dive into the extraordinary highs and lows of astronaut Kathy Sullivan's career. How she set records in space and underwater to become known as the "most vertical person in the world."

August 15, 2021

This week on MATTER OF FACT with Soledad O'Brien, impatience and frustration mark the growing gulf between Americans who are vaccinated and those who are unvaccinated. The deadly delta variant is spreading across the country, over-running emergency rooms and filling hospital beds. According to the CDC, more than 97-percent of people hospitalized for Covid-19 in mid-July were unvaccinated. And, as cases rise, hopes for normalcy dissipate. In an effort to overcome vaccine hesitancy, dozens of cities have taken their outreach to the streets. We visit one of those cities, Chicago, Illinois, where the vaccination rate stands at just 53 percent. There we go door-to-door with canvasser Lisa Butler, a Covid survivor who is determined to get her community vaccinated.

Then, Soledad hosts a conversation Dr. Laura Murray, a clinical psychologist and senior scientist at Johns Hopkins University School of Public Health about the psychology of those who remain vaccine hesitant, and the communication strategies that could convince them to get the shot. Hint: being negative or threatening doesn't work!

Plus, a dire warning for planet earth this week as the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change issued a report saying the threat from global warming within the next few decades will cause more flooding, more frequent, and longer heat waves, longer periods of drought, and larger and more destructive wildfires. Dr. Jessica Tierney, a lead author of the report and an associate professor at the University of Arizona, joins Soledad to talk about the plan of action that could pull us back from the climate cliff.

And the job market is hot! The Department of Labor says U.S. employers posted 10.1 million job openings in June, even after hiring 6.7 million workers. While much has been said about the demand for workers, little has been said about the training gap, and its impact on filling those jobs. Correspondent Jessica Gomez visits Cincinnati, Ohio and Boston, Massachusetts to explore an innovative approach to help workers get the skills that match the jobs.

In our Pop Quiz, we find out how much you know about the history of climate change. We've uncovered the story of an amateur scientist whose discovery in the 1850's could be the foundation of modern climate science. Want more information? We've got it.

And, finally, we look back to August 14, 1937 and the completion of the nation's longest marked footpath: the 2000-mile Appalachian Trail. Now that's a lot of steps!

August 22, 2021

This week on MATTER OF FACT with Soledad O'Brien, the world is watching as tragedy plays out in Afghanistan. America is scrambling to evacuate our citizens and their allies as the Taliban tightens their grip on the nation. Fear of the Taliban's brutal tactics is causing anxiety inside and outside the country. Correspondent Jessica Gomez spent part of the week with an Afghan community in Albuquerque, New Mexico. There she met a man who had worked as an interpreter for U.S. Coalition Forces. While he and his family have been resettled, they and their immediate circle of friends are monitoring the situation back home, frightened that their loved ones may never be free of Taliban control. The situation has them wondering if America will leave behind the Afghan people who assisted them.

Then, Soledad hosts a conversation with women's rights advocate, Zainab Salbi. Named by Foreign Policy Magazine as one of the "100 Leading Global Thinkers," Ms. Salbi is the founder of Women for Women International, a humanitarian aid and development organization working in Afghanistan to support women survivors of war. Soledad talks with Ms. Salbi about the situation inside Afghanistan as the Taliban return to power. They discuss the messages women are sending from within the country, and what the women's rights organization wants the Biden Administration to do to protect Afghan women and girls, before it's too late.

Plus, vaccine passports are NOT new! In fact, they date back to the time of the Plague. Soledad hosts a conversation with Dr. Peter Chin-Hong, an infectious disease specialist at the University of California, San Francisco Medical School, about the impact vaccine passports have had on tamping down disease. It's a conversation about the ways mandates have opened access to public and communal activities and the concerns about personal freedom. Dr. Chin-Hong addresses the impact of the Delta variant on the current dialogue.

Then, a follow-up to our coverage of police reform as a way of addressing on-going incidents of police violence. We look at Connecticut's statewide use-of-force training program, designed to standardize expectations and skillsets for police officers in any jurisdiction. The approach focuses on "moral courage," empathy, and de-escalation strategies. We explore the course content and the potential impact.

And finally, whales get some breathing room. The whales of Glacier Bay, Alaska are taking respite from the tourists. The marine traffic in the bay was cut in half by the pandemic. The result, the whales spread out and are having the time of their lives. With cruise ships returning, their vacations may be cut short. We'll show you how social distancing has changed their ways.

September 5, 2021

This week on MATTER OF FACT with Soledad O'Brien, the list of climate disasters fueling America's misery index just keeps growing. The aftermath of Hurricane Ida leaves New Orleans and the surrounding coastal areas without power, water, and gas. The storm's furious remnants pummeled the northeast, taking lives and causing massive destruction, and anxiety. The west is wounded by raging wildfires, as towns and businesses evacuate. In drought-stricken areas of Colorado, Nevada, Arizona, and California, homes, farms, and businesses are being cut off from dwindling water sources. Americans from coast to coast are increasingly at risk from these supercharged weather disasters. Soledad talks with Craig Colten, a geography professor and climate scientist at Louisiana State University, about expanding impact of climate change. They discuss communities can adapt to the extreme weather, the potential movement toward relocating entire communities, and the increasing pressures on federal funding for disaster aid. It's a compelling conversation about what to expect in the next few decades, and the strategies for preserving communities facing repeat disasters.

Then, Tennessee sets a new record as it reports more COVID cases per capita than any other state. Of those new cases, more than 38% are among children. Correspondent Jessica Gomez takes us to Shelby County, Tennessee, to see how school nurses and frontline caregivers are coping with a wave of cases affecting their youngest citizens. She follows a school nurse working in 19 schools to identify and track cases, and meets a family keeping vigil for their young daughter, fighting for life in the ICU. The backdrop for the story is the ongoing debate over school mask mandates. Tennessee Governor Bill Lee has banned mask mandates saying parents should be able to choose for their children. Doctors, nurses, and those infected, argue that vaccinated adults and masking requirements are the best protections for children too young to be vaccinated.

Plus, the 2020 Paralympic Games are ending in Tokyo this weekend. The Games have been a stage for athletes from more than 160 countries, inspiring the world with their strength and adaptability. Thirty-seven years ago, at the age of 19, alpine skier Bonnie St. John became the first African American to medal at the Paralympic Games, winning a silver and two bronze medals. But her story doesn't start or end on the slopes. Raised in San Diego, Bonnie had her right leg amputated below the knee when she was just 5 years old. That surgery put her on a path toward athleticism. After graduating from Harvard, she went on to become a Rhodes Scholar, a fortune 500 executive, and an advisor to the White House. NBC named her one of its "Five Most Inspiring Women in America." Our correspondent Julia Sun paid a visit to Bonnie's home in upstate New York, to talk about sports, determination, and resilience.

And, in our weekly segment, "We're Paying Attention Even if You're Too Busy," we take a look at the post-pandemic eviction crisis. Evictions are about to restart for people behind on their rent. That's the impact of a Supreme Court ruling putting an end to the federal eviction moratorium. Analysts at Goldman Sachs estimate 750-thousand renters are facing immediate eviction. Another three-point-five million households are at-risk because of mounting delinquencies. As for the impact on landlords, experts say unpaid rent totals nearly \$17 billion. Tenants were banking on federal help to pay their back rent, but the Emergency Rental Assistance Program has failed to get funds to those who needed them. We'll explain why only 12% of \$25 billion made it to tenants and their landlords.

And, in a moving "In Her Own Words" piece, Brenda gives us a look her newest passion: creating artwork that captures the heroic women who responded on 9/11.

Plus, critical care nurse Sandra Lindsay, the first person in the U.S. to get the COVID vaccine, joins Soledad to talk about the pandemic's impact on frontline caregivers, the stress and strain of each surge, and the need to achieve herd immunity in order to turn the pandemic around. It's a thoughtful conversation about burnout, the nursing profession and the potential for losing frontline caregivers to stress.

And, the bond between brothers that terrorists could not break. Soledad O'Brien tours the 9/11 Pentagon Memorial with Jim Laychak, the Executive Director. Laychak lost his brother, David, at the Pentagon on 9/11. His brother's death became the inspiration for building the memorial, and Laychak describes how honoring the lives lost became his life's work. We take a tour with Jim Laychak as he explains the unique design and how the crash site was turned into hallowed ground.

Then, are Americans ready to welcome the Afghan refugees desperate to build new lives? We take a look at the challenges of resettlement for tens of thousands of refugees entering the country. Correspondent Laura Chavez spent a few days at the Dallas - Fort Worth Refugee Outreach Service to see what's ahead for the Afghan communities seeking a footing in a foreign land. It's a preview to a special report we'll air in next weekend's show.

Finally, our VIEWFINDER. The staff photographers at the Albany Times Union and the Stamford Advocate share the photos they took on 9/11, as we reflect on the day 20 years ago when America wept.

September 19, 2021

This week on Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien, new beginnings for Afghan refugee families in America. Of the more than 120,000 people the U.S. airlifted from Afghanistan, nearly 65,000 were Afghans. Some flew directly to the U.S., while others were sent to one of 16 nations receiving refugees.

The U.S. issued SIV's, special immigrant visas—mostly to those who aided the U.S. Army as translators and interpreters. Afghans without those visas have been allowed entry under "humanitarian parole." Correspondent Laura Chavez spent several days at a resettlement agency in Texas that's preparing for an influx of families.. Her report focuses on the kinds of support families will need as they make this country their new home.

And, what's going on with the U.S. economy? Since the beginning of the pandemic, the U.S. economy has been propped up by a stimulus package that included several forms of direct aid to families. Now that assistance is lapsing, leaving us wondering, did the emergency support efforts work? What's the impact on our recovery and future rebound? Soledad talks with Wendy Edelberg, a macroeconomist and Director of the Hamilton Project at the Brookings Institution. They have a free-ranging discussion about inflation, the labor market, the potential for families to fall back into poverty without supports, and how household budgets will fare in the next quarter.

Plus, we take you on a tour of a microbrewery run by active gang members. It's the brainchild of serial entrepreneur George Taylor. Taylor got the idea after an incident of gang violence just outside his business in downtown Wilmington, North Carolina. His idea, provide economic opportunity and curb gang violence.

Correspondent Jessica Gomez explores the idea and the outcomes with Taylor, some of the gang members who've taken on management roles at the brewery, and the District Attorney. It's a story sure to spark discussions about second chances and changing lives.

Then, we look ahead to a story we'll be bringing you next week, when Correspondent Dina Demetrius visits Caldor, California, where raging wildfires forced a massive evacuation. Finally, how a wrong turn by climate scientists led to a discovery. Danish researchers looking for the northernmost island off Greenland, overshot their destination, only to discover an island, even further to the north. Their small discovery could change your world maps. We've got the pictures to prove it!

September 26, 2021

This week on Matter of Fact with Soledad O'Brien we take an in-depth look at the impact of global warming. Catastrophic weather events are increasingly affecting people around the world. A World Bank report predicts that without immediate action, disasters will displace more than 200 million people by 2050. In the U.S., hurricanes, tropical storms, and wildfires are already pushing people from their homes and destabilizing communities. In California, the Caldor Fire, the 15th largest in state history, has burned nearly a quarter million acres, and forced up to 60,000 people from their homes. Despite the destruction, not one life has been lost. Matter of Fact Correspondent Dina Demetrius shares the story of the massive effort to move people to safety and their heartbreaking return to devastating loss.

Then, climate scientists around the world are sounding the alarm on climate change. They point to intensifying hurricanes, widespread droughts, and the increasing number of heat waves. In fact, records from the last three months show nearly one in three Americans live in a county hit by a weather disaster. With all the evidence, why are there still so many climate change deniers? Professor Katharine Hayhoe is an atmospheric scientist and evangelical Christian who studies climate-fueled disasters. She talks with Soledad about her new book, "Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divide World." Hear her ideas for turning skeptics into believers.

Plus, fighting environmental racism is never easy. The communities targeted are often under-resourced and lack political power to fight big polluters. That's the story of Warren County, North Carolina. In the 1980's, the state was determined to create a 25-acre dumpsite for soil contaminated with PCBs, known cancer-causing agents, near Warren County. Special Contributor Joie Chen visited Warren County, and brings us the story of Dollie Burwell, the woman who led her community's effort to battle the state and big polluters. It's a story about the true cost of environmental justice.

And every piece of plastic ever created is still on the planet in some form or other. In fact, just nine percent of plastic products actually get recycled. Now, state and federal lawmakers are working to make businesses pay for the recycling of their plastic packaging. We'll explain what's behind the initiatives, and consider the question: is America ready to break free from plastic?

Finally, some good environmental news. We check in on cheetah, the world's fastest animal, to see how small efforts are improving their odds of survival. And we give you a look at the Butterfly Highway in the United Kingdom. It's a pollinator pathway improving bug life and air quality – all at the same time.
