Here in Washington the US House of Representatives voted late Tuesday to censure democratic congresswoman Rashida Talib over anti-Israel remarks. 22 Democrats joined Republicans in voting 234 to 188 to formally rebuke the Palestinian American lawmaker from Michigan. Talib has defended a controversial phrase used by anti-Israel protesters which calls for eradicating the Jewish nation. In a video she warned President Biden that people will remember his support for “the genocide of the Palestinian people”.

The Supreme Court is indicating it will weigh in on whether President Trump can stand trial for criminal charges allegedly committed while in office. Special counsel Jack Smith asked the high court Monday to rule on whether Trump can be prosecuted on charges he plotted to overturn the 2020 election. Smith is seeking to skip the federal appeals court and avoid delaying the trial until after next year's presidential election in which Trump is the Front-runner. The Supreme Court asked Trump's attorneys to respond to the special council's motion by next week. The court does not meet again until January 5th.

In some cases, Jewish students are suing their schools because they don't feel safe on campus. CBN's Brody Carter reports from New York. The Jewish population in New York City is roughly 10%. At Columbia University they're in the top 15 of private universities by Jewish population and Jewish students that we've talked to at CBN they tell us they simply don't feel safe here. One freshman even filing a lawsuit against the university for failing to protect her against anti-Semitism.

41 states are suing tech giant Meta over youth mental health issues stemming from the use of its social media platforms. Multiple lawsuits charged Instagram and Facebook are designed to addict young people and Meta uses the platforms to collect data on children without parental consent. The states are seeking financial damages restitution to those harmed and an end to alleged illegal practices. Meta says it is working to create safer environments for young people and is disappointed by the lawsuits.

A politician in Finland who endured a year's long legal battle for sharing her biblical views on sexuality has been found not guilty of hate speech. In 2019, Dr Pivi Rosenan a member of The Finnish Parliament tweeted a text from the book of Romans which calls homosexuality a sin, adding to her legal troubles a radio interview and a pamphlet she'd written on Biblical views on sexuality 20 years earlier. The Helsinki court of appeals today upheld a lower Court's ruling unanimously dismissing three criminal charges against she could have faced two years in prison or a heavy fine.

A massive settlement to help thousands of victims of America's opioid epidemic rests on the Supreme Court. Billions of dollars meant to compensate victims' families is at stake. OxyContin maker Purdue Pharma agreed to a settlement back in 2012. At question should the company's owners the Sackler family be afforded common bankrupt protections essentially shielding family members from personal liability. Court Watchers say it is one of the most significant bankruptcy cases in decades.
