"Red Ball Express" - Over 8,000 African-American soldiers serving in WW II met the challenge of keeping the fastest moving army in history supplied, enabling the liberation of France from Nazi occupation in August 1944. Proceeding with the invasion of France, Patton's Third Army advanced so far toward Paris that it cannot be supplied. To keep up the momentum, Allied HQ establishes an elite military truck route. One platoon, Red Ball Express, encountered private enmities, bypassed enemy pockets, minefields, and increasingly perilous missions.

"Valaida Snow" - A glamorous diva, she traveled throughout Europe performing before royalty. Tragically her rise to stardom was derailed when she became ensnared by the Nazis war machine during WWII and imprisoned in a concentration camp in Wester-Faengle. Eighteen months later, she was freed as an exchange prisoner and allowed to return to New York; tragically, Snow never fully recovered from the ordeal.
