Broadcast WDEF-TV 12.1,12.2 and 12.3

CBS SUNDAY MORNING – Airs Sunday morning 9:00-10:30 am. This weekly program covers the latest spot news and weather and includes a variety of other items such as health, travel and the arts. A good variety of topics that range from coast to coast locally, nationally and internationally.

FACE THE NATION - Airs Sundays 10:30-11:30am as one hour program. This weekly program covers the hot topics in the news. It features a weekly moderator with guest interviewer and panelists to discuss various current news topics.

POINT OF VIEW – Airs Saturday 3:30-4am and 6:30-7am on 12.1. WDEF-TV produces this weekly ½ hour program. It covers various topics from local politics, ethics, inner city violence, education, the arts, and health issues. It is a good example of programming that reflects the current concerns, needs and interest of the community.

60 MINUTES – Airs Sunday 7:00 – 8:00pm. This program usually features three separate segments on different subjects from investigative reports to interviews with presidents, congressional representatives, and everyday citizens.

48 HOURS INVESTIGATES – Airs on Saturday 10:00 – 11:00pm (moves to other times/days on occasion). A weekly program, it usually covers one subject in depth. The subject matter varies from violence, to missing children, to the AIDS epidemic, to the airline crashes. It is reflective of what is currently on the minds of Americans.

NEWS 12 THIS MORNING – Airs from 5:00 – 7:00am Monday through Friday on WDEF 12.1. It is hosted by two co-anchors and a meteorologist and encompasses news, weather, and community affairs. It contains live interviews and taped segments. It covers a variety of subjects ranging from health and consumer related issues to cultural and social events. The program also gives viewers an opportunity to call in and ask medical, legal and other consumer questions of qualified professionals in various fields live on the air. Also provides a forum for local community leaders to appear on the show and take phone calls from the public.

NEWS 12 AT 12:00 noon, 6:00pm, 7:00pm and 11:00pm Airs on 12.1 – The news programs air Monday through Friday. Weekend editions air Saturday and Sunday at 11:00pm. The programs consist of news, weather and taped segments, mostly local news with some national news packages from CBS.

WHAT'S RIGHT WITH OUR SCHOOLS – A segment in our newscasts on Mondays which features positive elements within our schools. It varies from people, places to things which help to improve the educational process for our children.

GOLDEN APPLE – Every other Tuesday (during the school year), during our 6:00pm newscast, an area teacher is saluted as being instrumental in a child's life. The dedication and efforts by the teacher who has helped motivate and direct many young people in the right direction. The teachers are nominated by parents-students or co-workers.

HIGH NOON WITH HAMILTON COUNTY SHERIFF - Twice a month on our noon newscast Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Hammond answers questions from the viewers regarding community issues related to law enforcement.
